

A DRAWN GAME.

On Tuesday these companions in distress at the bottom of the League table met at Loughborough in fine weather before a small crowd. The "Luffs" were not quite at full strength, while the Luton team was as follows :—Daw ; Williams and McCurdy ; Brock, Dawson and J. Brown ; W. Brown, Durrant, McInnes, Eckford and Dimmock. In the first half Luton had rather the best of the play and scored the only point notched before half-time. A brilliant run was made by McInnes, who tricked several opponents and passed to Durrant, the latter sending through the goal. The second half was very even, each side pressing in turn.
