The visitors won the toss, and had the advantage of the wind in the first half. The early exchanges however, were very even. Hawkes had hard luck with a good shot which just went over the bar. The vicators' left wing got down, and the back failing to clear, the ball was passed out to Pridmore, who easily buat Smart with a cross shot.
