

LUTON v. MILLWALL.

For this Southern League match at Millwall on Saturday, Luton had to muster a poor team, owing to the injuries to players sustained on the previous day against Kettering. There was a large holiday crowd of 4,000 to see the match, and the Luton Red Cross Band played on the ground. The teams were—

Millwall : Griffiths ; Shutt and Davidson ; Caie, Miller, and Henderson ; Dryburgh, Sharples, Carnelly, Banks, and Wilson.

Luton : Ord ; Street and White ; Hawkes, Cox, and Williams ; Durrant, Blessington, Barker, Plummer, and Brown.

The visitors won the toss, but Millwall had most of the play. After 2 minutes, Carnelly opened the score. Banks added a second, and Durrant scored Luton's only goal before the interval. But for the splendid display of Ord in goal, Millwall would have made a big score in the second half. Banks succeeded in scoring again, and Millwall thus won by 3 goals to 1.

At Luton in the previous week, Millwall were defeated by 2 goals to nil.
