## THE EASTER MATCHES.

### LUTON AND THE SOUTHERN LEAGUE.

#### LUTON v. WELLINGBOROUGH.

This match was played on Saturday afternoon before a good crowd. The following were the teams: *Wellingborough*: Ord; Dartnell and Rodway; Hamilton, Griffiths, and Davis; Webb, Brett, McCairns, Bamford, and Hyde. *Luton*: Frail; Lindsay and Williams; F. Hawkes, White, and R. Hawkes; Durrant, Blessington, Gall, and Allsopp. Referee: Mr. W. T. Reed (London). "Roger" Ord had a great reception from the crowd. It will be seen that *Luton* was without Moody who sprained the muscles of his leg the previous day.

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*Luton* at once got to the *Wellingborough* goal and made a fierce attack. Four corners fell to the home side and from the last one the ball was rushed through. There was an appeal against the point by the *Wellingborough* players apparently on the ground that Ord had been impeded. Then the visitors broke away and Hyde placed high over the bar. Afterwards Frail was seriously tested with a couple of shots which he repulsed and his second save was a very good one. Though both sides pressed there was no more scoring up to half-time when the score stood:

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Directly after the re-start *Luton* again attacked and Davidson placed in a very hot shot which Ord cleared very finely. Gall made a good run on the left and ended up with an excellent shot at goal, the ball struck the post and rebounded, and Davidson sent into the net. Following some interesting play the backs missed a long volley by Lindsay and Gall running by notched the third goal with a shot which gave Ord no chance to save. The *Wellingborough* forwards then put a lot of sting in their attack and McCairns scored with a fine shot. The game thus ended:
