Brentford won the toss and kicked with the advantage of the wind. Luton were soon on the aggressive, About 10 minutes from the start, during severe pressure on the Brentford goal, one of the backs deliberately handled within the 12 yards' line and Lindsay scored with a fine shot. Just afterwards White managed to get in a shot which scored. Luton made a smart run and Moody placed in a fine shot which just missed the mark. Blessington ran the ball to within a yard of the goal-line and centred, but Gall was given off-side after he had headed through. Maher tried a shot at goal, but the ball went sailing over the bar. The second half was simply awful, the play being wretched in the extreme. The visitors played the one back game, having only 10 men, and the Luton forward, and half-backs, too, were continually off-side. At one point the ball stood close to the goal and three of the Brentford men stood looking at it, too tired to kick it away.
