There was an attendance of only about 3,000—one of the poorest gates of the season for a Southern League match—but this was due principally to the rainy state of the weather. The ground appeared to be in good condition, having received some careful attention, but the game had not been in progress long before the mud was so churned up that it resembled a quagmire. A light wind, which blew diagonally across the pitch, was just strong enough to influence play. McCurdy tossed with Mavin for choice of position, but the Luton vice-captain lost the toss and Brown had to start the ball rolling against the wind.

Keeping up the aggression New Brompton secured a corner, but once more Barnes got away and went down the wing in fine style. Walton closely followed in persuit, so Barnes' only course was to pass the ball forward for Pickering who was just behind, but Walton nipped in and kicked away. The visitors turned the tables on the home side and Platt had to save. Then Warner at the other end received a long pass from Brown and put in a very dangerous shot which went over the bar. The Luton outside right forced a corner, which he placed well, and Martin had to fist out. Blackett tried from long range, but just as the goalie was making for the ball at one end of the goal it struck one of the backs and nearly went in at the other, Martin only just clearing.

Still putting on the screw, and assisted by a foul, Fred Hawkes essayed an attempt but Bull town was well up and headed through, thus giving Luton the lead. Barnfather, who, though a little chap, was ever on the alert, next transferred play to the opposite half of the field, and sent in a tremendous shot which Platt was rather lucky to save just against the post.
