LUTON (4) v. NEW BROMPTON (1).

Monday football in United League contests is generally of a sedate character, and that at Gillingham on Monday, between New Brompton and Luton, was no exception to the rule. Yet, though play was leisurely, it was not devoid of interest. Both sides showed pretty work, sandwiched between periods of mediocrity. As the result indicates, Luton were rather too good for New Brompton. Their defence was particularly strong, and their halves followed their forwards with skill and judgment. Playing against such poor wing half-backs, their forwards were not much harrassed, having plenty of rope. Consequently their attacks were much more dangerous than the ill-supported advance of the home front rank. The interval score was 1 each, but during the second period Luton added 3 goals (Barnes, Gittins, and Brown).
