TOTTENHAM v. LUTON.

Luton had out a fairly representative side, but the Hotspurs were poorly represented. Tottenham were easily worth their two-goals victory. The home teams' young players showed good form, and Payne was especially conspicuous. He knows the geography of the goal posts and the first goal he scored was with a nice ground shot. McNair appeared again at outside left, and the second point that Tottenham scored, through Seeburg, was from a centre of his. Whyman was often times dangerous. Manning made several good saves. Tait and Watson were again the Hotspur backs, and left nothing to be desired in their display. Luton's defence was uncertain, Hogg was the better back, and Jones worked as hard as ever. Pearson was too slow to be effective, and taking the visitors' forward rank was disappointing.
