The whole of the homesters' six goals were obtained in the first half and the Norwich supporters were much elated over the team's easiest victory this season.

Although Jarvis should have saved two of the shots that scored he did some brilliant work. The Luton defence was weak and until the second period when the Canaries slowed down the Strawhatters' forwards showed poor form. As will be seen the losers were a good deal below full strength, injuries having played havoc with some of their most reliable men.

Lamberton, the ex-Lutonian, gave Norwich the lead four minutes from the start and Dunning added the second ten minutes later. Four points followed quickly from Lamberton, Bushell, Dunning and Whiteman so that the City led by six goals inside half-an-hour. The Bedfordshire men improved in the second half and while Rankin was away injured Pearson scored the only goal of this period with a long shot that Roney misjudged.

Of the 5,000 spectators present about 240 were excursionists from Luton.
