

Replayed English Cup-Tie.

FINE PERFORMANCE BY LUTON.

Luton Town journeyed to Southend on Wednesday for the re-played tie against Southend United in the English Cup, and won by 4-2 after a hard struggle, and playing extra time. The sides were practically the same as at Luton on Saturday. Menzies was still unable to appear at centre-forward, and Bradley took his place. Brown was, however, able to turn out on the wing, Stansfield being sent back to his usual position.

"Bob" Hawkes won the toss, and decided to kick with the sun at Luton's back. Both sides soon settled down, and the opening exchanges were even. Quite early "Bob" was brought down just outside the penalty area, and the referee awarded a free kick. The captain himself took the shot, and sent well in. The Southend backs failed to clear, and Moody scored.

Before the interval Ronaldson equalised, and put Southend ahead soon after resuming. Haycock, however, finished a fine run by scoring for Luton.

The referee ordered an extra half-hour. Moody and Brown scored for Luton, who will now meet Millwall here in the next round.
