LUTON LOSE AT SOUTHEND.

Luton Town lost badly at Southend on Saturday. Indeed the Blues greatly disappointed their supporters. Last season the Essex team succeeded in sharing the points, winning 2-0 at home and losing 0-3 at Luton; but this season they have only allowed us to have one point out of the four. Elarlier in the season they drew on the Ivy-road ground 3-3, and on Saturday they won 4-1.

Luton had one alteration on their side, Hedley turning out in place of Chapman. The home side were at full strength.

Seeing that the sides were so evenly matched

at Luton, the result was expected to be a very close affair. "Bob" won the spin for Luton, whose early efforts were very disjointed, and Southend quickly took a firm hold on the game.
