LUTON LOSE THEIR LAST MATCH.

HARDEST LUCK OF THE SEASON.

Playing against Portsmouth in their last match of the season, on the Ivy-road ground_ Luton lost by the only goal scored. A match like it has probably never been seen on the L ton enclosure. Never before perhaps has a goal been peppered from start to finish, like Portsmouth's goal on Saturday, without ever once falling. That was Luton's experience in the "finishing up" match.

"Bob" stood down again on Saturday in favour of Johnson. Our old friend Haycock was included in the visiting team. Portsmouth were set to face a strong wind, but they took up the running from the kick-off, and success came in less than three minutes. Chapman conceded a corner. This was fruitless, and then Portsmouth retaliated, and a good run and centie by Birtles gave Kirby a chance to open the score. Jarvis misjudged the ball and ran out, leaving the goal vacant, so that "Pompey's" centre-forward had no difficulty in finding the net.

A smart run by Luton followed, and Smith should have equalised but Warner stopped him. Cope had several shots to stop, of which one from Quinn was the best. A fine attack on the part of Portsmouth followed, and Williams tried a fine shot from the wing, which Jarvis had some difficulty in clearing.

The visitors next forced two abortives corners, and continued to have the best of

ma ters for some time, but they were unable to penetrate the home defence. At last Luton broke away, and Moody tried a shot which went wide. Luton improved, and the Portsmouth goal was subjected to a severe bombardment, but Cope was equal to the occasion. Half-time arrived with the score 1-0 in favour of Portsmouth. The second half opened with strong work by Luton, but Warner kicked away before his

goalkeeper was troubled. Kirby then got away, but shot tamely at the finish. The home side then went down, and after Moody had put in an unsuccessful thot, Fred Hawkes sent over the bar. The home side kept up the pressure for a time, and here obtained a corner, but failed to turn it to account. Portsmouth then made a couple of minor attacks, but on each occasion Jarvis kicked away, Both sides were keeping up the pressure pretty well, and end to end play was the order. Cope had a hot shot from Stansfield

to save, and Thomson headed out when Brown sent in a nice attempt. Luton were now the better side. They went through several times in a masterly style, but bad luck and poor shooting spoilt their chances.
