The Portsmouth defence were able to check the winger before he got in too close. Good work by Price and Holland nearly brought about the downfall of Pompey's goal, but Sanderson went to his knees and cleverly stopped the final shot. Then Stephenson dropped the ball in from near the right corner, and it alighted on the net just behind the bar. Dowling did some very smart work, being quick in turning and shooting without wasting a moment. Luton's left wing had a turn, Holland slipping the ball out towards Worth, who went away at a fine pace and drove it right across the goal-mouth. It was one of the sort that he practised with so much success earlier in the season. The home goal had a narrow escape from a shot by Young which passed square across the goal-mouth; the slightest touch would have deflected it into the net. Sanderson saved from Wileman and Hawkes, after which Young and Rollinson got away to good effect, and Abbott had to get down to clear.
