Luton's Fine Performance at Watford.

There was a £291 gate at Watford on Good Friday, when Luton were the visitors. The teams were:—

Luton—Mitchell; Elvey and Dunn; F. Hawkes Frith, and R. Hawkes; Roberts, Roe, Simms, Rollinson, and Hoar.

Watford — Williams; Bulling and Stewart; V. Gregory, Kennedy, and F. Gregory; Hastings, Ronald, Edmonds, Green, and Waterall.

Referee, Mr. C. C. Fallowfield (London).

It was Watford's first home defeat since November 28th last.

Practically the first time Luton appeared dangerous they scored. A nice pass from Bob Hawkes gave Roe his opportunity, and he sent the ball right across, and Hoar sent in a rising shot which found the net.

After this Hastings was getting away when he was fouled by Dunn, but there is no doubt that the actual foul took place at least two yards outside the penalty area. Both players fell inside the crease, and after consulting his linesmen the referee awarded a penalty kick to Watford. Kennedy took this and beat Mitchell.

Almost directly from the re-start Hoar went away in fine style, and, finishing up with a perfect centre, gave Simms one of the chances he appreciates. He promptly put Luton ahead again.

In the second half Simms increased Luton's lead, Ronald replied for Watford, and Roberts put the question beyond doubt. Result:—
