



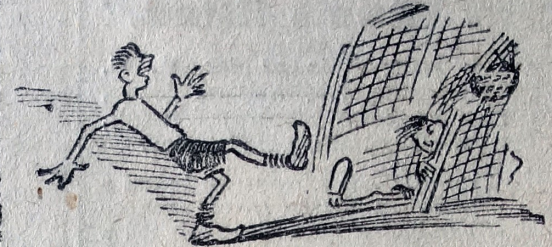

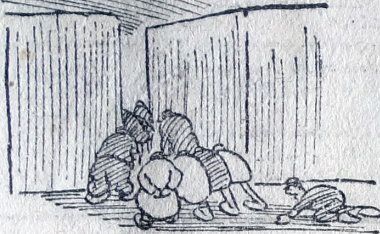


HURRIED BACK WITH HIM
