that E. Marshall was present and took an active part in the proceedings. The first officials were elected, and Eddie was chosen as vice-captain, and in the opening game on Siemens' Meadow, v. Wesley United—which, by the way, was won bythe Athletic 6—1—Marshall filled the centre-half position.

During the seventeen years that have elapsed the Club has steadily progressed until we find them to-day playing with the leading clubs of the South, with Eddie still amongst its playing members. It is a record of which he may justly be proud.

His enthusiasm for the game and for his side has been one of the Club's greatest assets in days gone by; his determination, pluck and earnest endeavour to give of his best under all sorts of conditions, often resulting in a game seemingly lost being pulled out of the fire. To-day's Fixtures.

At home to-day we receive a visit from a club that has made history in Southern football and one ever welcome in this district, viz., Luton, and we anticipate their team receiving a big ovation on taking the field this afternoon. They have had a splendid season from a playing point of view, and earlier on gave every promise of being well in the running for promotion; they have, however, fallen away somewhat in the race for promotion, and will apparently have to be content with the third or fourth position. But it should be noted that their forwards are in the forefront as far as goalscoring is concerned. As a team, they will no doubt be out to-day to enhance their prestige, and it will be a big feather in the cap of our lads if they succeed in lowering the colours of this extremely capable side.

Our Reserves will be at Luton, whom they succeeded in beating at Charlton last week, and we shall all, I feel, be extremely pleased if they are successful upon this occasion.

#### Next Week's Matches.

On Monday next we have as visitors the Swindon Reserves, in a Southern League game; kick-off 5.30 p.m. A keen and interesting game may be anticipated, and a good crowd would be welcome.

Next Thursday, April 27th, the Seniors journey to Newport to play the County the League game postponed from April 1st owing to the weather conditions. Newport occupy a lowly position in the League Table, but may be relied upon to put up a big fight, and our lads will have to go all out to win.

Next Saturday, April 29th, they play Swindon, at the Railway centre; and here again they will be up against it, the Wiltshire side being a most difficult one to beat, their forwards being very capable in the goal-scoring line.

At home we have a real good game on this date, Tottenham Hotspur Reserves being due at Charlton in a London Combination game. The Spurs are well in the running for the champion-ship, and may be depended upon to make a bold bid for the maximum points on this occasion. We are looking forward to a splendid tussle.

#### Round About.

It is welcome news that one of the oldest friends and supporters of the Club, and a present Director, Mr. Tom Sullivan, is about again after a bad turn. One sincerely hopes that he will make an early and complete return to a full measure of health and strength.

We are also glad to learn that Mr. W. Manchester is making a good recovery from a very serious illness, and earnestly wish him a speedy restoration to the best of health.

It is hoped to hold a Mammoth Fete and Gala at Whitsuntide, possibly extending over two days—Saturday and Monday. There will be a variety of sporting events, including Athletics, Mounted Events, Physical Drill and the South of England Brass Band Championship Contest.
