COMMENTS.

After the games at Swindon and Reading supporters will not be surprised to see so many changes in the team to-day. Their record to date is a very disappointing one, and there can be no doubt that it is not in accord with the reputations of the players any more than it is a true indication of the merits of the players judged upon last season's games. We have been badly hit by injuries, but the fact cannot be disguised that play has fallen far below standard. We can only hope that the loss of form is temporary, and that they will all realise their best. It is better that the selection of the team should be difficult because all are doing well than that it should be harassing because they are doing ill. So five changes are made. Jennings returns to the pivotal position,

and Roe comes in again at left-half. In the forward line Cockle gets a chance to prove his qualities as a centre-forward, a position in which he first came into prominence. Hoten reappears at inside-left, and Dennis resumes on the extreme.

Our visitors have had a bad time also. After losing their first three games consecutively they won twice and then drew, but then lost their next two games at home, whereas we have an unbeaten home record. From the side defeated at Aberdare last Saturday by the only goal scored they have made changes. Burgess, former West Ham player, gives way to Lister, the former Bournemouth centre-forward. Brophy, who was tried in the centre, returns to half-back, and Barnett, whose versatility is shown by the fact

that he has played back and half-back, now comes in at inside-left. Harwood, the old Pompey half-back, who was with Swansea last season, and almost all the other players, have visited Luton before.

CONCERNING ABERDARE.

A plucky little club that was formed during the boom in South Wales a dozen years ago. The Secretary is Mr. G. Beaumont, 20, College-street, Aberdare, and the club survives to-day very largely because of the wonderful support received from the miners of the district, who have a supporters' club worthy of the name.

The ground is the Ynys Field, and is capable of considerable expansion, being in a very wide, open area, yet close to the town. The colours of the club are blue and gold.

Last season the stand was burned down, and it was feared the club might go under, but the miners would not hear of it.

The record attendance for the ground was made on April 2nd, 1923, when Bristol City attracted 16,350 people, and the gate receipts realised £361.

They played in the Second Division of the Southern League for some years, and were admitted to the Southern League in 1921-22. Their records have been as follows:

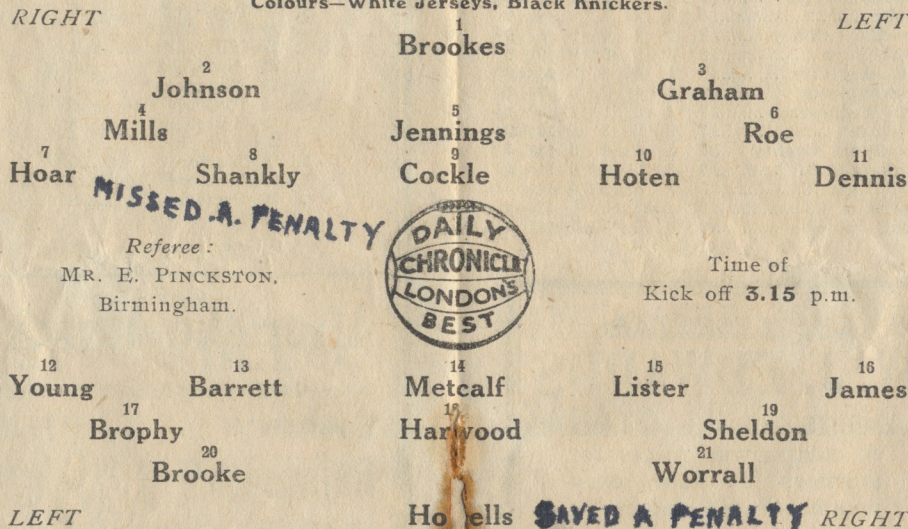

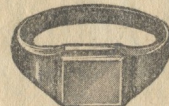

"SCARAMOUCHE."

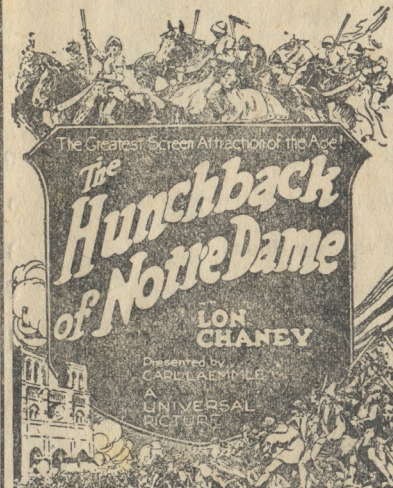
