Luton Draw With League Leaders

It was a good game, the football generally being keen and clean, although there were spells of offside tactics, in which the visitors' backs excelled, and these did not help to improve the standard of the play. Swansea could claim to be the better side for 20 minutes, and the more skilful individually, perhaps, but the Town did the greater part of the pressing, and it was once again the inability of the inside men to drive bone the attacks that prevented the Town from getting the two points. Reid made several good efforts in the first chance by handling, but the several serim mages in the visiting goal found the visitors' defence equal to all demands. At the Luton end Brookes had many shots to stop, but they were nearly all from long range, and the "own defenders were on top just as much as the of the visiting club.

Anderson and Till were magnificht at back, and the latter gave a brilliant display. The halves were strong and reso-lute, and any attempt by the clever visit-ing forwards was thwarted. All of them played splendidly in defence and did a fair amount in attack. The forwards again combined well in midfield, but were slow in front of goal. Reid was the most enterprising, with Thirlaway running him close. Kerr distributed nicely, but could not control the ball well when he got the chance to go through. Dennis and Shankly also played industriously and got through

a lot of good work.

For Swansea, Morley and Langford were clever backs, Collins was the best half on the field, and of the forwards the wigg men were the most dangerous.
