

LUTON BEAT FULHAM IN THE CUP

4 Goals to 1 Victory in the Replayed Match

RENNIE IN GREAT FORM

By four goals to one Luton beat Fulham in the replayed second round Cup-tie at Luton yesterday and so qualified to receive Crystal Palace in the Bedfordshire town in the next stage of the national knockout tournament.

The game opened interestingly enough, but considerable roughness crept in as the play progressed.

Inside three minutes Bedford put Luton ahead, following a neat movement by Yardley, and the subsequent play favoured the Strawplaiters, who revealed better combination than their rivals.

After fourteen minutes' play Oliver brought Roe down in the penalty area, but Mason saved Rennie's spot kick. Luton continued to hold the upper hand, and before half-time Yardley scored a second goal from a pass by Rennie,

who was the cleverest forward in the game.

Yardley headed a fine goal soon after the second half started, and Rennie put on a fourth for Luton not long afterwards. Luton were far the better side, and indeed it was not until near the end that Fulham ever looked like scoring.

Then Price, a tireless worker, who should have been better supported, worked his way through the defence and shot. Abbott saved, but could not clear, and Temple ran in quickly and walked the ball to the net without any opposition.
