COMMENTS.

We may almost suppose that the gallant effort of Brighton and Hove Albion to overhaul Plymouth and Brentford has failed with their defeat at Shepherd's Bush on Thursday. In the race for promotion the Albion's possible is 63 points against the Argyle's 70 and Brentford's 68. All three are away this afternoon, and so if the Albion win and the other two lose there will yet be an outside chance.

They have put up a splendid struggle, in any case, but we hope to see our lads peg them back a little farther this afternoon.

The Albion have notified one change from the side beaten by the Rangers, and that is Walker for Smith, at inside-left. Walker scored the goal by which the Albion Reserves won on our ground last Saturday. Among the new men the Albion have in their team this season are Marsden, from Notts. Forest; Dutton, who came from West Bromwich Albion; Vallance, from Queen's Park Rangers; Walker, from Walsall, and their latest acquisition, McDonald, who was transferred from Reading about a fortnight ago.

We are glad to field the team that has done duty in the last three games, and we hope to win.

Shareholders should note that the meeting for the election of three directors will take place on Monday night at the offices of the Luton and District Chamber of Trade, 72, George Street, at 7 p.m.

Particulars of our latest professional, Ernest W. H. Gale, the Southall centre-half, have appeared in the Press this week. He plays at West Ham this afternoon.
