

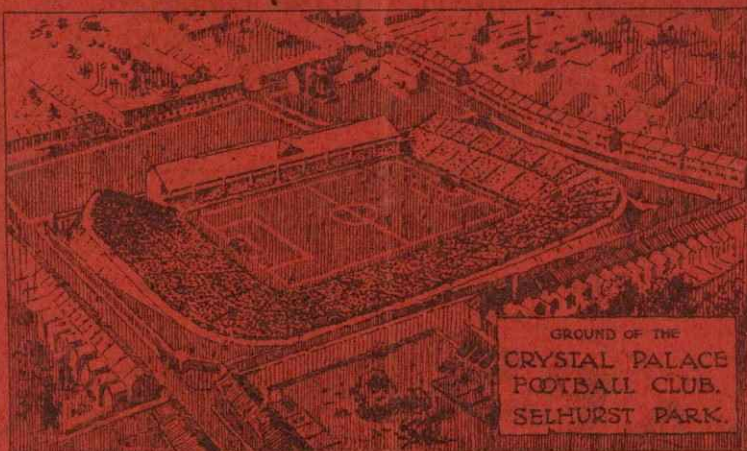

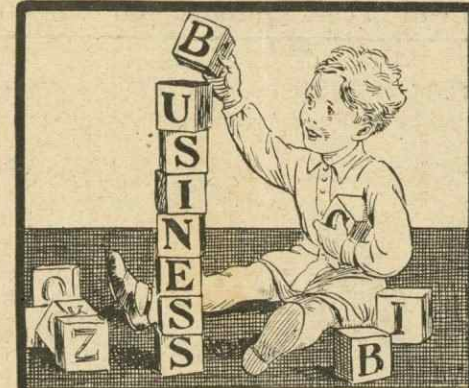

The End in Sight.

Easter is always a critical time for clubs concerned in promotion and relegation struggles, and coming so late as it does this season it is even more critical than usual. The fate of more than one club will probably be decided by the time the holiday games are concluded. With Easter over, the end of the season is in sight, for there are only two more Saturdays before the League programme is finished.

Since writing these notes the Good Friday and Easter Saturday games will have been played so it is difficult for me to say much. I should imagine our boys found themselves "up against it" at Luton, who are our visitors to-day, on Friday for the "Strawplaiters" rarely give anything away on their own ground. I shall be surprised if they have not won against luckless Merthyr on Saturday, however. At the time of writing the Welsh club has conceded 120 goals.

Charlesworth's Treble.

Despite the absence of Simpson, with throat trouble, the Palace beat Torquay comfortably by 4-2 the other Saturday, and should have won by an even greater margin. Against a weak pair of backs they had chances galore, but A. W. Bayes played a magnificent game in goal and once again the Palace shooting was not all it should have been. Charlesworth succeeded Griffiths and Havelock as Simpson's deputy and playing with great dash he scored three goals.

He did not display Simpson's finesse, but used his head well and showed a good turn of speed. The Torquay backs made things easier for him but all the same he had every reason to be satisfied with his performance. Three of the weakest

defences seen at Selhurst Park this season have been those of Bristol Rovers, Clapton Orient and Torquay, and Simpson has been unlucky inasmuch as illness or injury has kept him out of these games, amongst others. If it had not been for this he would have stood a good chance of heading the individual goal scoring table for the Section.

Plymouth at Last.

As I explained above I am writing in the dark, but by their fine win at Fulham, Plymouth have put promotion well within their grasp, certainly not before it is due. I think every true sportsman has felt sorry for the Argyle who, season after season, were just pipped on the post, Luton did them a good turn by beating Brentford who, unless Plymouth side-slipped on Friday and Saturday, look as if they have lost their chance. At the same time they are to be congratulated upon having put up such a fine fight.

At the other end of the Southern Section ladder Merthyr Town seem fated to finish up on the lowest rung. They have struggled gamely through the season with but little encouragement, and beneath the shadow of industrial depression. The odds are against their being in the League next season. Gillingham may have to repeat last season's formula and seek re-election unless, which is quite likely, they can prevail upon Bristol Rovers to "hold the baby."

Famous Club's Peril.

After drawing level with Oldham and Blackpool, Chelsea "caught a packet" at Swansea in their attempts to get back to the First Division. At the time of writing, however, they are not without hope, for Oldham and Blackpool are in opposition over the holidays. Sheffield Wednesday seem certain to win the League championship for the second year in succession, but it is quite a change to find that no London team seems in danger of relegation either from the First or Second division.

By losing at home to Grimsby it looks as if Everton are booked for Second Division football next season which, for such a famous and wealthy club, is something of a tragedy. I believe I am right in saying that Everton have never before experienced Second Division football. Their companions in misfortune will probably be either Grimsby or Newcastle, another famous and wealthy club. This season has shown in striking fashion that money does not always buy success, even in football.

**KENT BOYS v. LEICESTERSHIRE BOYS
Easter Wednesday, Kick-off 6.30.**

The Kent boys are coming to Selhurst Park on Easter Wednesday, when their opponents will be Leicestershire boys. Many will no doubt remember the previous boys County games played on our ground, when Paris and Yorkshire boys were entertained. This will be the first visit to Kent of the lads from the Midlands. They are, we understand, a strong combination, and have this season already defeated Notts boys and Warwickshire boys. By way of contrast, Kent have defeated Surrey and Middlesex, but lost to London boys.

Included in the Kent team are three local boys: Macdonald, Norman, and Coles. These three boys are the pick of the Beckenham and Penge boys, who last Saturday were defeated (by 1-0) in the Semi-Final of the Corinthian Shield by West Ham boys.

The right back of the Kent team—Harry Norman, a local product—is considered, by those who have watched his progress, to be a boy of outstanding promise. Fast and fearless, he is a boy of whom more will be heard later. He has already received London as well as Kent honours.

Eric Macdonald (right half for Kent), who learnt his early football in Croydon, at the Winterbourne School, is rather on the slow side, but nevertheless, is an artist with the ball.

St. John's Boy's School, Penge, in providing two boys in the Kent County team (E. Macdonald and J. Peggall), has created a county record.

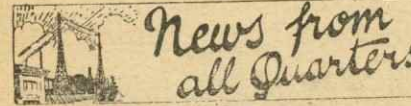
Swansea's dramatic bid for safety in the Second Division is in no small way due to Handford, a local discovery, who is destined to make a big name for himself in football.

Ernest England, the Sunderland back, has just had his second benefit sanctioned by the League. It may be his last season with Sunderland.

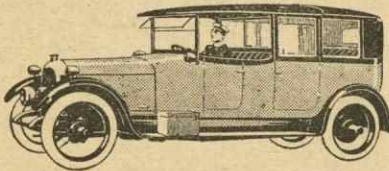
Sheffield Wednesday, in their long history, have had 30 players "capped" by one or other of the four countries, and those players have made 108 international appearances.
