

HAT-TRICK BY LEE

ALDERSHOT LAST BETTER THAN LUTON

Aldershot 4, Luton 3

Lee, Aldershot's outside-left, had a field day against Luton, scoring three excellent goals. It was largely because of his opportunism that Aldershot won their Southern Section Cup-tie against Luton.

Much of the play was dull and uninteresting, but Aldershot did so well in the last half-hour that they thoroughly deserved to win.

Luton were the superior side in the first half, and Aldershot were lucky to be on terms at the interval. During this period the Luton forwards combined cleverly, and Bell, at centre-forward, was always dangerous.

The Aldershot defence, which included four reserves, was very uncertain, Burgess, in particular, being easily beaten, but Higgs, who took Robbs' place in goal, made a number of fine saves.

Gerrard, the reserve right-half, also showed excellent form, and was the best half on the field. Mackey and Kean defended soundly for Luton, but Kingham was never happy against Lee.

After the change of ends little was seen of the Luton forwards, while the Aldershot attack settled down to play admirably. They combined well at top speed, but it was not until four minutes before the end that Lee scored the winning goal.

Isard was always dangerous, and all four goals followed good play by the Aldershot right winger. Bell scored twice for Luton in the first half, and Aldershot equalised through Sharp and Lee. Lee put Aldershot ahead early in the second half, and Martin equalised. Then came Lee's match-winning effort.
