BAD MISHAP TO FRASER

That sterling servant of Luton, Charles Fraser, who captained the side in the absence of Mackey, had the misfortune to sustain a fracture of the right leg just below the knee about twenty minutes from the end of the game.

As usual he had taken a conspicuous part in the brilliance of Luton's attacks and was cutting in for goal when sharply but quite fairly tackled by Gerrard. The crack was heard all over the ground. Fraser was moved to the Bute Hospital.

Gerrard was deeply distressed and so were his colleagues and opponents, for the game

had been very cleanly fought.

Aldershot have never before had six goals scored against them in the League. How often they have had to thank Willie Robb, the old international goalkeeper, would be hard to estimate, but only his brilliant exhibition averted an avalanche of goals.

GALLANT ROBB

From start to finish Luton virtually monopolised the play, their forwards and flank halves dominating the game by delightful combination, while the marksmanship was first class.

Bell rammed home a great goal after five minutes. Following fine saves by Robb, Stephenson twice converted centres from Crompton and after Thayne had badly miskicked to allow Oakes to score for the visitors, Bell replied with two more for Luton.

Only once was Robb beaten in the second period, Roberts scoring a capital goal.

Aldershot rarely made contact with Coen and the only really troublesome shot he had to save was from Oakes.

Smith was a sound back for Luton, and Brown and Fraser were grand halves, while Roberts was the Alex James of the attack, in which every player was at his best.
