PAYNE'S AMAZING APPEARANCE AS CENTRE

Luton Run Into Double Figures Against Bristol Rovers

There was nothing very springlike about the weather this afternoon, and Luton Town football ground was a very cold and cheerless place, except for the brightness of the crowd. The attendance was very seriously affected by the wintry conditions, sleet falling before and during the game.
