

Mardon Hat-Trick Upsets Division III Leaders

THE County sprung a surprise on the Third Division (South) leaders at Luton yesterday, but in a game spoiled by wretched conditions the County were full value for their handsome win.

Luton experimented with the side owing to injuries and sickness and the forward changes were not successful, although Beresford did pretty well.

Compared with the County, however, they showed no liking for the mud, and there were precious few attempts at combination among the forwards.

Boston, playing in the place of Mackey, at back, put up a fine exhibition, and the halves did well, but the forwards gave them little respite and when chances came their way, the marksmanship was poor.

On the other hand, the County forwards were the strong part of the team, their combination being brilliant and their shooting well directed.

Mardon, understudy to Hughie Gallacher, quickly scored a couple, but they were dis-

counted when Hodge and Beresford got brilliant goals for Luton.

After the interval the County outshone and outplayed their opponents. Mardon completed the hat-trick, and Ferguson made the usual sale.
