Clever Blackpool Held By Ten Men

LUTON TOWN FAILED to oust BLACK-POOL from the F.A. Cup competition on Saturday, but they must have increased their hold upon the supporters by the magnificent manner in which they pulled an apparently lost game out of the fire, and qualified for a further meeting at Blackpool yesterday.
