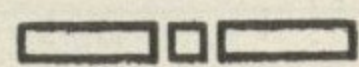

TONIGHT we play off one of our "extra" matches due to postponements on account of F.A. Cup Ties, Gillingham being our visitors. To them we extend our sincere cordialities.

The men of Kent have had an excellent season this term and but for one or two slight lapses recently, would have held a more exalted position. Last Saturday's result with them proved to be such a lapse for Clapton Orient defeated them on their own enclosure by two clear goals. This will doubtless make the "Hoppers" all the more keen this evening, and as they have also quite a good away record, our boys will need to be right out if we are to obtain those two much needed points. Victories have been gained at Bristol Rovers by three clear goals, at Shepherds Bush where the Rangers succumbed by the odd goal in three, and at Southend and Torquay by two clear goals, whilst drawn games of one goal each have been the result of their visits to Crystal Palace and Exeter City.

The following are a few notes regarding the "Hoppers" team to do duty here this evening.

Whitelaw (goalkeeper) Joined Gillingham from Southend United. Now in his second term with them. Was previously on Bristol City's staff.

Hartley (right full back) A recruit, and last term was wearing Clapton Orient's colours. A stern defender.

Lester (left full back) A local boy who did service for Chatham before signing a "pro" form. Still follows his occupation as a postal official.

Randle (right half back) Hails from Derbyshire and has seen service with Southend United and Birmingham.

Armstrong (centre half back) Comes from the Tyneside area and had a spell with Aston Villa prior to throwing in his lot with Swindon Town. Joined Gillingham this season.

Hopkins (left half back) A Bilston boy from which Club he was obtained as a centre half. Has been converted into a wing half back recently. Gillingham is his only professional club.

Fowler (outside right) Can be looked upon as a native for Northfleet is his domicile, and continues to follow his employment there. Was persuaded to change his amateur status at the end of last season.

Wilson (inside right) Another player who is also a local and who continues to follow his profession. Played with Sheppey United and is engaged in the dockyards. This is his first season as a professional.

Watson (centre forward) Went from the "Cobblers" to the "Hoppers," and was converted into the inside right position. Now fills the centre position.

Robinson (inside left) Was also formerly with the "Cobblers," his other clubs being Chesterfield and Birmingham.

Scott (outside left) Another local who has recently been persuaded to join the professional ranks. Equally at home on both wings.

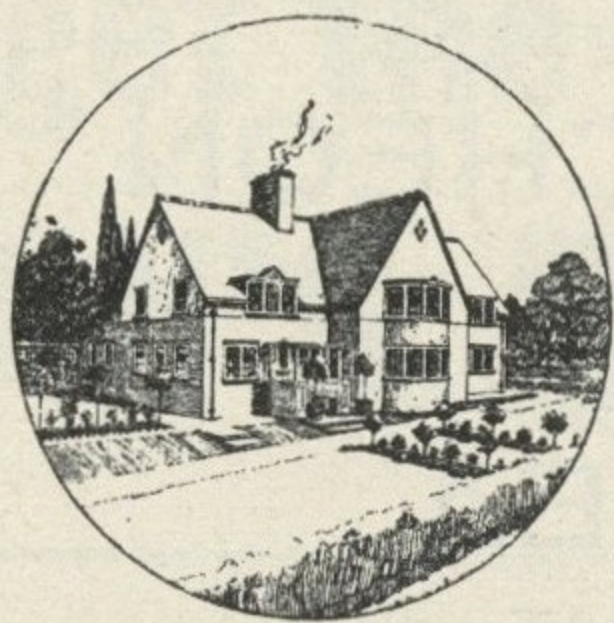

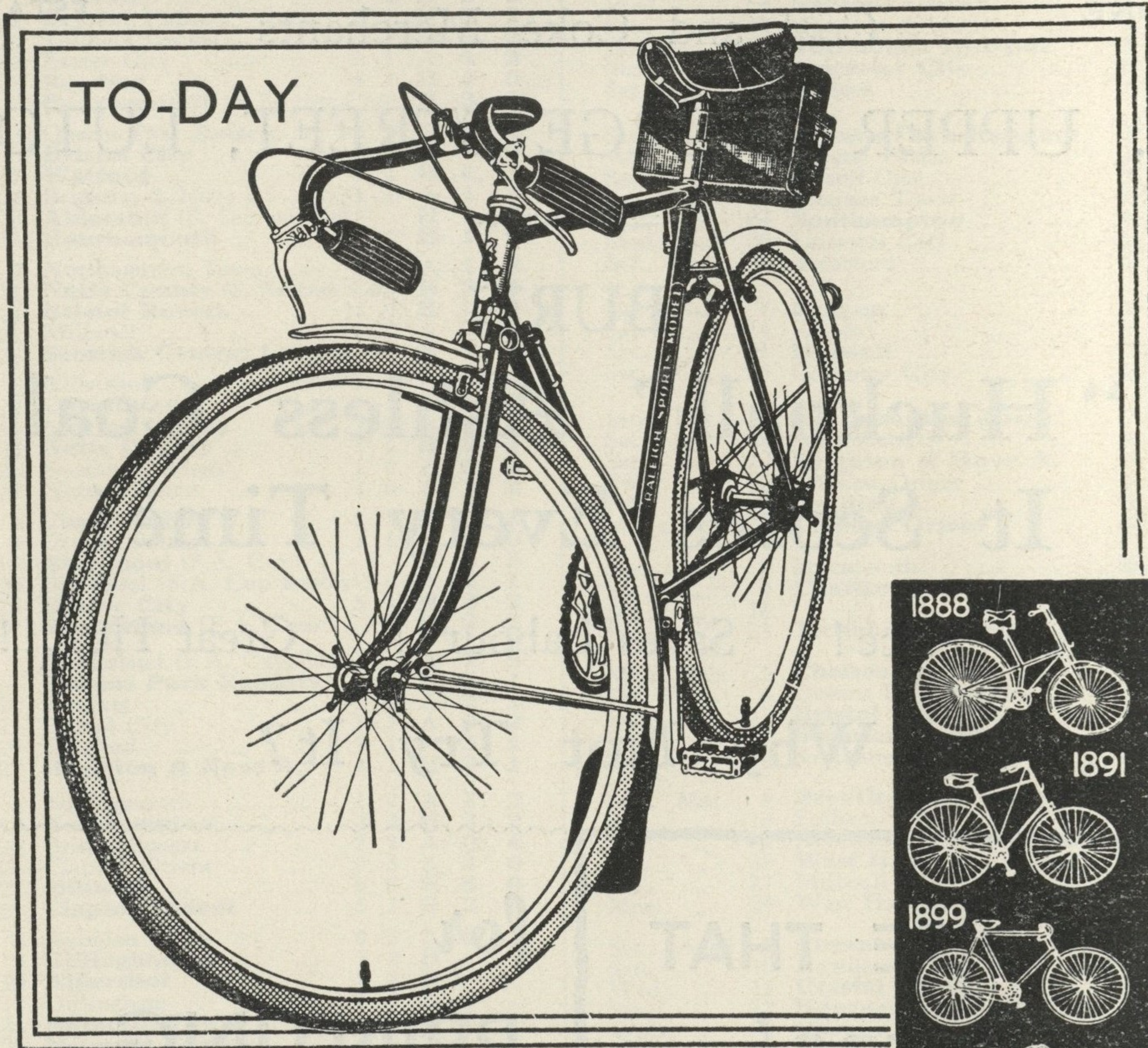

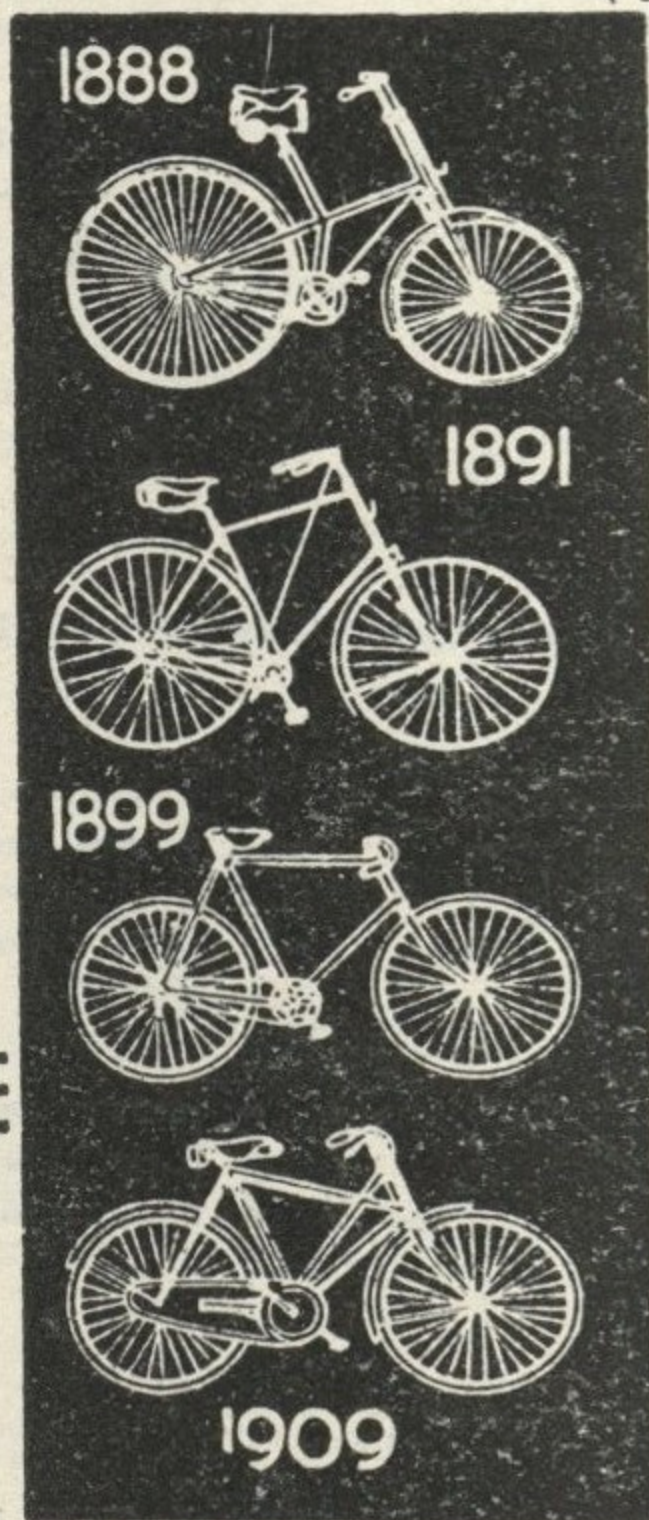
