

THIS afternoon we entertain Aldershot, and we extend to them a hearty welcome on another

The game between us has a semblance of a David and Goliath aspect for whilst we are striving to carry off the championship of the Division, the men from the Army town are fighting desperately to avoid the wooden spoon and consequently stave off the stigma of having to apply for re-election. They have an uphill fight however, for even now they are five points behind their nearest unfortunates. The result of the match this afternoon is by no means a foregone conclusion, although we all hope our boys will pull through, as indeed they must if the coveted honour is to be our lot. Injuries have played havoc with the Aldershot team this term and to a club with only little financial resources this is certainly tragic, and may be able to explain a deal as to why they do not hold a more exalted position. Although we hope they will not improve at our expense this afternoon, it is however our sincere wish that the future will have brighter days in store for them.

The following are a few notes regarding the Aldershot team on duty here today.

- H. Wright (goalkeeper) Was born in London and played for Resley Avenue School as an outside right. On leaving school joined up with Barnet as the custodian of the citadel. Left Barnet for Harwich and Parkstone from which Club he joined Aldershot after successful negotiations had taken place with Charlton Athletic for whom he had signed an amateur form. Represented England against Scotland in King George's Jubilee game 1935. Height 6ft. 1½ ins. Weight 12 st. 6lb.
- R. T. Wade (right full back) Born at Ilford for which Club he played as an amateur before turning "pro." His first professional Club was West Ham with whom he remained three seasons before joining Aldershot. Is the holder of an amateur cup medal. Height 6ft. Weight 12 st.
- G. Williams (left full back) Born in Ynysddiv, Wales. Played for Cumfelinfach School and was in the final trial for schoolboy international honours. Played for his native village before

- joining Watchville Rangers from which club he went to the Charlton nursery, Bexley Heath. Height 6ft. Weight 13 st. 2lb.
- B. Diaper (right half back) Born at Southampton and played for Harland and Wolff before joining Cowes. Since that time was three years at Arsenal, before joining Luton, Fulham and Charlton. Has represented the London Football Association on two occasions. Height 5ft. 8ins. Weight 11 st. 4lbs.
- E. D. Gerrard (centre half back) A local. When in the Army his football attracted more than one club. In his fifth season with his club. Height 5ft. 11 ins. Weight 11 st. 6 lbs.
- J. Buller (left half back) A native of Chilton, Durham and played for Chilton Colliery, Spennymoor United, Hartlepools and Stoke City. Was with the latter club four seasons. Is more of an attacking half than a defender. Height 5 ft. 7½ ins. Weight 11 st. 10 lb.
- R. F. Thomas (outside right) A Welshman by birth and also a recruit, his transfer being obtained from Charlton early this season. Height 5ft. 6in. Weight 10 st. 8lb.
- W. G. Hinton (inside right) Joined Aldershot last season having previously been on the books of Norwich City. Has been on the injured list all this season prior to three weeks ago, due to an injury sustained in the practice matches. Height 5ft. 10 in. Weight 11 st.
- C. H. Ray (centre forward) Born at Lewes, Sussex and played for his native town. Joined Aldershot last season. Height 5ft. 10 ins. Weight 11 st. 10 lb.
- W. V. Clarke (inside left) A native of Newport. Played for Newport Rovers before joining Newport County. After three seasons was transferred to Portsmouth, but after one season with "Pompey" was allowed to go to Brighton. Height 5 ft. 8½ ins. Weight 11 st: 6 lb.
- H. H. Butt (outside left) Signed from Charlton in January of this year, being secured from Bath City by the London Club after a Cup Tie between the two clubs. Height 5ft. 8ins. Weight 11 st.
