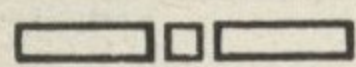

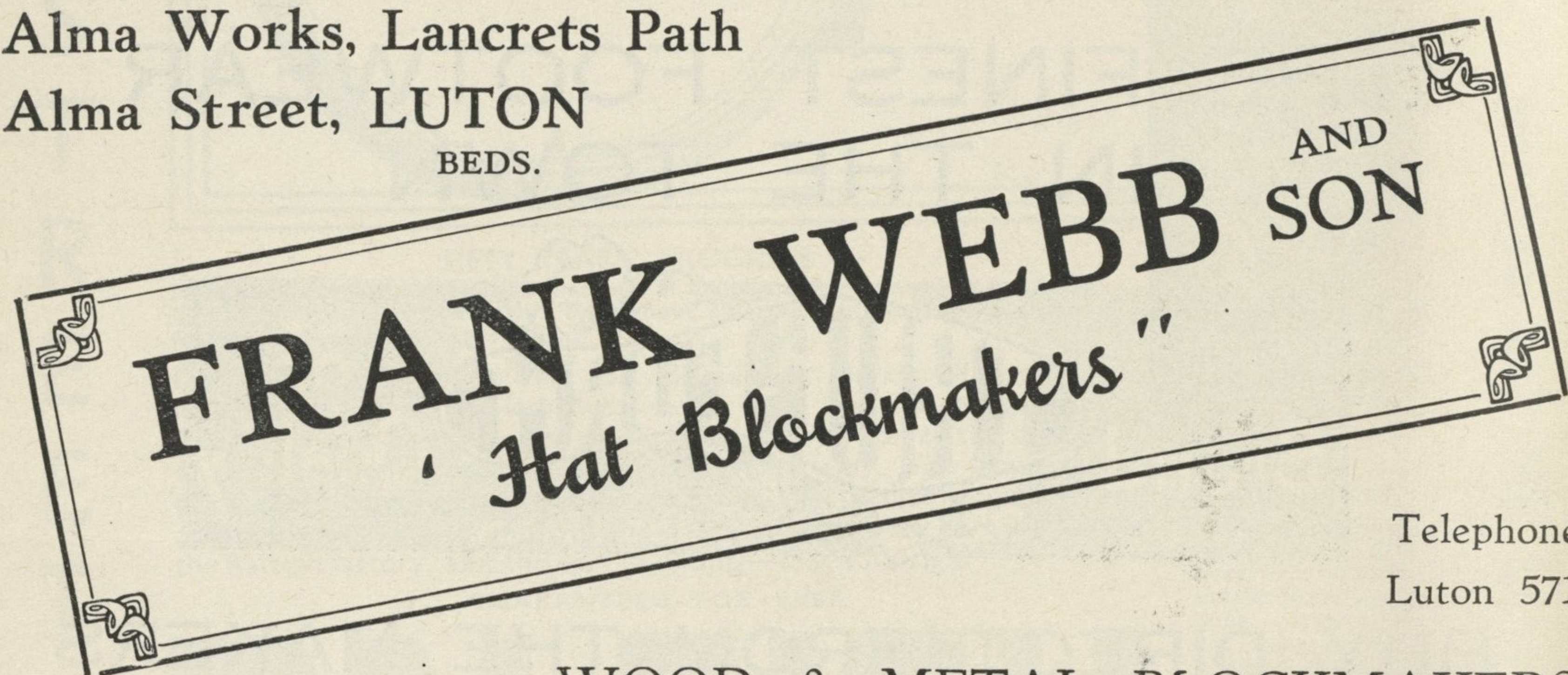

TONIGHT we welcome old friends and rivals in Swindon Town and extend to them once again our sincere cordialities as our guests. The games between our respective clubs have always been ding-dong struggles with the fortunes of each club varying from time to time. Whilst the County Ground has never been a good omen to us, Swindon can repay the compliment by saying that the Kenilworth Road enclosure has been the scene of many Waterloo's for them. Still in spite of this good-natured rivalry we have always been on the most friendly terms and the games with Swindon Town are always looked forward to with interest.

This season we were able to make a division of the points at the County Ground, George Stephenson scoring the equalising goal nearly on time. The results that day buoyed up our hopes for better things to come, but alas, last Saturday practically knocked the bottom out of our ambitions. Still the championship of the League is not won or lost until May 1st is over and who knows anything might happen between now and then. No one was more sorry over our defeat at Gillingham than our boys themselves, in fact they were nearly heart broken, but these things will happen. All clubs in turn have their periods of good fortune and their periods of misfortune; perhaps our good time is still to come. Who knows?

Frank Wildman (goalkeeper) released by Reading, was snapped up by Manager Ted Vizard during last close season, and has proved the best keeper Swindon have had on their books for many years. Went down with pneumonia in November but made fine recovery and is now playing better than ever.

Thomas Duckworth (right back) has missed only three League matches in this his third season with Swindon. A good clubman and one of the most consistent members of the side, he was with Bolton Wanderers before joining Swindon.

Jack Smith (left back) has not missed a League match since joining the club, having made, with today's match, 81 consecutive appearances in the side. Was with Merthyr Town, Wolves and Bristol Rovers before being taken on by Manager Vizard. A sound defender and one who should go far in the game.

Harry Cousins (right half) has been ever present this term. Secured from Chesterfield he is about to complete five seasons with the club and has proved one of the best captures made during the closing stages of Mr. Sam Allen's term as secretary-manager. A good 90 mins. player who can take plenty of hard knocks.

George Morrall (centre half) is the former Birmingham skipper. A fine general, he has proved a popular figure and has had the distinction of scoring three goals this season.

Stanley Wilcockson (left half) has had service with Queens Park Rangers, York City and Leeds United. A stylish type of player, he has proved his versatility by deputising for Morrall on occasions.

Eddie Jones (outside right) played for Wales as a schoolboy and was at Bolton three seasons before being persuaded to come South. An exceedingly promising winger, possessing a good turn of speed, is not afraid to attempt to beat his man on the run, and has proved himself a rare opportunist.

Alan Fowler (inside right) one of the "dwarfs" of the side yet brilliant with his head. Known to the Swindon crowd as "Alan the Jack-in-the-Box." Played for Swindon for the first time in 1934-35. A good goal-getter and a 100 per cent team man.

James Cookson (centre forward) arrived at Swindon via Chesterfield, West Bromwich Albion and Plymouth Argyle. Still knows the way to goal as demonstrated by the fact that prior to this evening he had scored no fewer than 25 League goals for the Railway club this season.

James Musgrave (inside left) was secured from West Ham about midway through the season. A go ahead type of player, he has also appeared with success at left half.

Arthur Hetherington (outside left) cost Swindon a goodly transfer fee during the close season but has proved his worth as a go ahead and dangerous winger. Was with Preston North End before joining Swindon. Has speed and exquisite ball control.

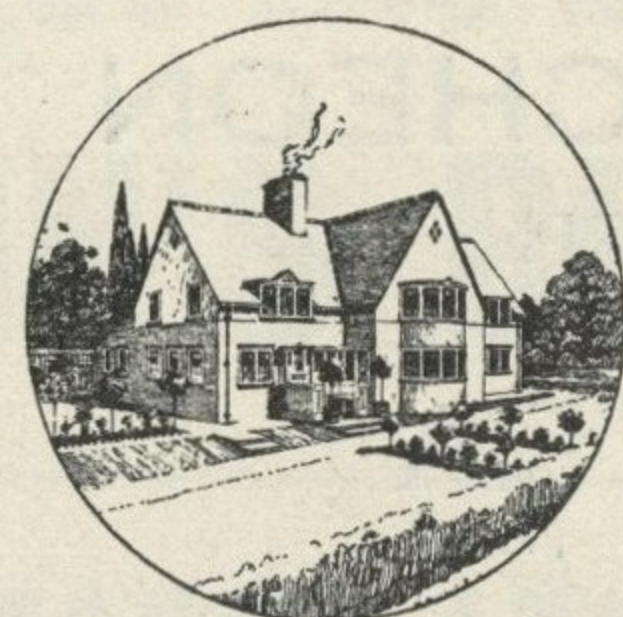

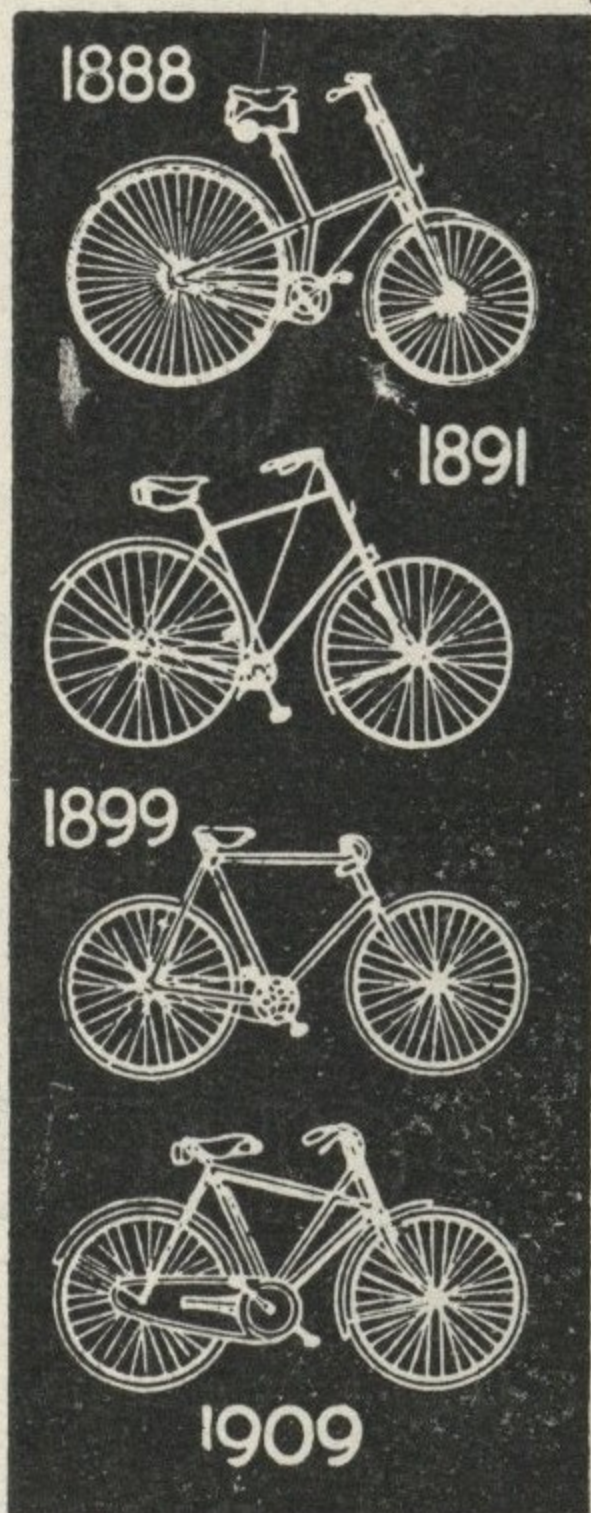
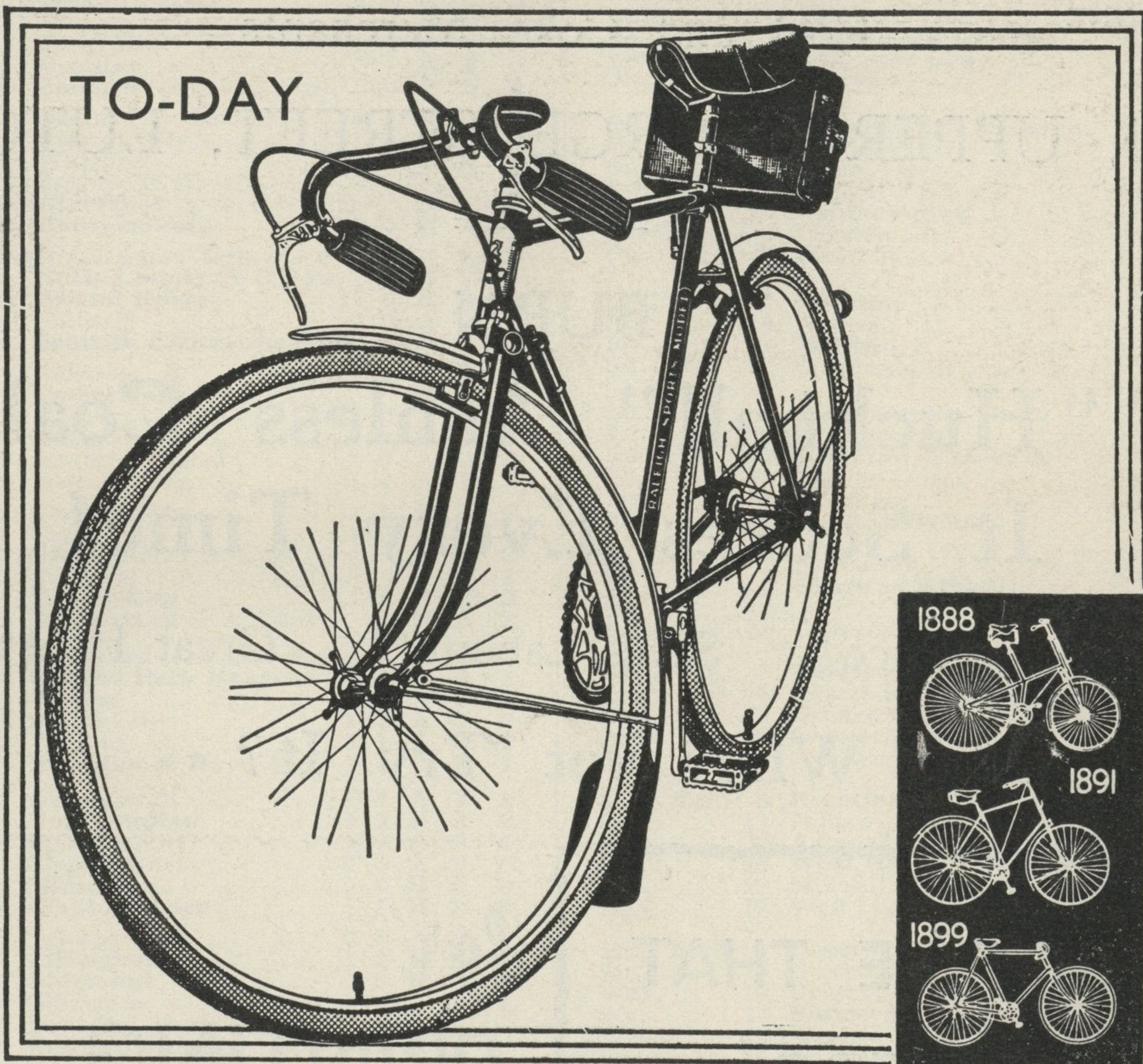
