WE GREET very cordially this afternoon, Tottenham Hotspur, for the relationship between our respective clubs has always been of a most cordial nature, and on more than one occasion in our past days, have we been the recipients of acts of kindness from the Tottenham Club. Who does not remember Charlie Fraser's Benefit Match when the Spurs sent down their full League side, just to mention one instance. We do not forget these matters and accordingly we hope the Spurs will avail themselves of our hospitality today.

It was in 1882, when there existed the Hotspur Cricket Club, mostly comprised of boys attending Mr. Cameron's school and also the Grammar School, that the idea was born to formulate a football Club. There were 18 members at the end of the first year and the opening match with a club outside the district was against Homerton College.

Among the most interesting items concerning the Club, is the reason why it was called Hotspur. At an original meeting it appeared that one of the lads had been reading the history of England in the early fifteenth century and he was full of admiration for Henry Percy, nicknamed Hotspur, son of the Earl of Northumberland, who performed prodigies of valour on the field of battle. Thus it came about that the Hotspur Football Club began as a real organisation.

Financial worries were unknown at the commencement, but later the Club encountered many difficulties. They have been established on a very firm basis in recent years. The first private ground occupied was at North Park on which the team played in 1888, and during the summer months the pitch was let out for tennis tournaments. The season 1895-6 was the most momentous in the early history of the Spurs, when it was decided that professionalism should be adopted. Another interesting item is that in 1898, whilst playing Woolwich Arsenal, the stand collapsed and five persons were seriously hurt. The following year the Club entered the Southern League, the United League and the Thames and Medway competition. Their successes in F.A. Cup include winning the trophy in 1901 and 1921. In the latter season they were also runners-up in the League.

A notable landmark in the Spurs history occured in 1908, when they were elected to the Second Division of the Football League owing to the withdrawal of Stoke City. The Spurs were promoted to Division I at the end of season 1932/3 only to be relegated to the lower division at the end of 1934/5.




