## Nearer The Safety Line Luton Town Vanquish Swansea

LUTON TOWN brought off a big victory against SWANSEA TOWN, and thus drew nearer the safety line, while they kept the Welsh club in the danger zone.

IT WAS A REMARKABLE SUCCESS, for the Town forwards alternated between periods of sheer brilliance and lackadaisical ineptitude. Not until the last four minutes was the victory assured, and then three goals scored in quick succession determined the day.

NELSON was the outstanding figure in the Town defence, though Dolman did good work. Finlayson and Feliowes also served their forwards with grand passes, and of the attack Connelly often produced wonderful football, but spoilt it by showiness. Stephenson was the most consistently dangerous forward.

AFTER A RAID by the Town the visitors got away and Fellowes brought down Lewis (H.), a penalty kick being awarded. This was taken by Warner, who shot tamely and straight to Dolman, who cleared. Then the Town came back, and in a strong attack Stephenson struck the post after an effort by Vinall had been repelled.

TOWN PRESSED HOTLY, but failed to control the ball at close quarters and also found difficulty in retaining a foothold when they tried a shot. Connelly missed an open goal, and then several corners were forced without success. though John made fine saves.

WHEN SWANSEA ATTACKED Olsen shot weakly when he had a fine chance, and there followed a terrific shock attack on the Swansea goal. John saved from Ferguson, but before he could get the ball away Roberts had headed it out of his hands, and in the struggle that followed on the goal line CONNELLY forced the ball into the net.

SWANSEA'S GOAL had further escapes. and then the visitors rallied gamely and gave Dolman trouble. He saved splen-

didly two or three times, but in a very bright passing movement the defence was well beaten, and OLSEN was left with an easy chance, of which he took full toll to level the scores.

LUTON were soon attacking again, and a minute before change of ends there was a rush which resulted in another scrimmage in the Swansea goal-mouth, and STEPHENSON banged the ball in, a defender trying vainly to knock the ball out with his hand.

IT WAS NEARLY ALL LUTON for a long time in the second half, but the forwards were altogether too slow when they came to grips with the visiting defenders. John, however, was in magnificent form, and saved his side again and again with remarkable goalkeeping.

STEPHENSON, ROBERTS AND CON-NELLY seemed certain to score, but John got the ball away with acrobatic leaps and safe handling. At times his judgment was uncanny. Many corners were forced on either wing, but the visitors stuck gamely to their work, and tackled keenly.

NOW AND THEN SWANSEA AWAY, but they did not give Dolman a lot of trouble, and spectators were leaving the ground when the goal rush came. The Town left wing stormed through, and FERGUSON converted a centre from Stephenson. There followed another swift thrust and CONNELLY headed a great goal from Stephenson's pass, and with the last effort of the game FERGUSON added a fifth goal.
