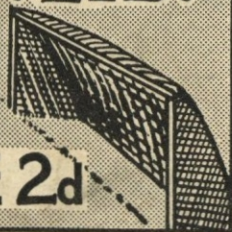

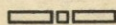

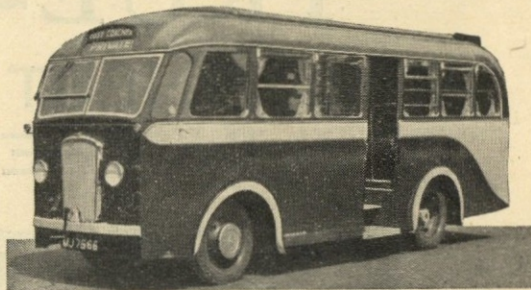

### CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

THE 'Stiffs' have taken all the limelight during the past week and deservedly so, for they accomplished two grand performances by winning at Charlton and Leicester. The Charlton victory on Saturday last was only made possible in the last two minutes of the game when Bill Redfern scored the winning goal. I did not see this match myself, but from information received the 'Stiffs' thoroughly deserved their bonus, and especially so as Charlton had fielded a strong side which included Hobbins, Rist and Owens. On Monday, Leicester were overwhelmed by five clear goals at their Filbert Street enclosure, and this in spite of the fact that Hugh Billington was injured after about ten minutes play. The 'Stiffs' are playing grand football at present, and are deserving of all the praise bestowed on them. Today they are at Fulham, a tough nut to crack, but not beyond them on past performances. The team for duty is the same as previously with the exception that Clark takes the injured Billington's place, whilst Tony Carroll makes an appearance at outside right, following his long absence through injury. May they keep up the good work.

The visit of the Spurs did not produce the game of football expected. The whistle had to be used much too frequently, what with the offside tactics and the petty infringements that were produced. Whilst I am aware that the 'offside game' is perfectly legitimate and in accordance with the rules of the game, I am afraid that I cannot subscribe to the fact that it is an entertainment. It makes spectators irritable, and justly so, for they have made the turnstiles click in order to witness skill and craft with a ball. Now I suppose someone will tell me there is skill and craft in playing the 'offside game.'

We welcome as our guests today Bradford Park Avenue, who occupy rung number nine in the League Table. Of the four matches they have played away from home two have been won and two have been lost. Norwich City were beaten by

three goals to one, whilst on Saturday last Bury were defeated by the only goal of the match. At home Manchester City, Sheffield Wednesday and Tranmere Rovers have all been made to bite the dust, whilst Swansea Town effected a draw of one goal each and Blackburn Rovers went one better by winning by four clear goals. Bradford have got together a fine workmanlike side and will upset the calculations of a good number of clubs. The following are a few notes on their individual players for today's game.

**T. F. Farr** (goal). Height 5 ft. 10½ in. Weight 12 stones. Born Bathgate in West Lothian. Secured from Blackburn Athletic, September, 1934.

**U. Lindley** (right back). Height 5 ft. 9 in. Weight 12 stones. Born Sheffield. Previous club Preston North End. Secured summer of 1937.

**R. Johnstone** (left back). Height 5 ft. 9½ in. Weight 12 stones. Born Coldstream in Berwickshire. Signed from Heart of Midlothian, May, 1935, as an outside right.

**G. H. Stabb** (right half). Height 5 ft. 7½ in. Weight 13 stones. Born Paignton, Devon. Signed from Port Vale in September, 1936. Was a forward but has been converted with some success.

**R. Danskin** (centre half). Height 5 ft. 8 in. Weight 11 st. 7 lb. Born Scotswood-on-Tyne. Secured from Leeds United, December 1932.

**W. Hallard** (left half). Height 5 ft. 9 in. Weight 11 stones. Born St. Helens. Secured from Bury during the summer of 1937.

**H. M. Paton** (outside right). Height 5 ft. 8 in. Weight 10 st. 6 lb. Born Glasgow. Secured from a Scottish Junior Club, Shettleston United during the close season of 1938.

**W. Martin** (inside right). Height 5 ft. 6 in. Weight 10 st. 5 lb. Born Glasgow. Secured from a Scottish Junior Club, Shawfield Juniors, in February, 1937.

**G. H. Henson** (centre half). Height 5ft. 11 in. Weight 12 st. 7 lb. Born Stony-Stratford, in Bucks. Transfer obtained from Swansea Town, July, 1937. Last season's second division leading goal-scorer.

**J. McCall** (inside left). Height 5ft. 7 in. Weight 10 st. 7 lb. Born Glasgow. Secured along with his late colleague MacPhee from Workington, in October, 1936.

**T. H. Lewis** (outside left). Height 5ft. 9 in. Weight 13 stones. Born Ellesmere Post. Obtained from Wrexham F.C. in June, 1933.

The "A" team did exceedingly well against Spalding United, last Saturday, by winning by four goals to one, the scorers being Duggan 2, Griffin and Strathie. They are without a match today, but on Saturday next we visit Biggleswade, in the Bedfordshire Invitation Cup.

**JOE COEN**

Joseph Leo Coen first saw the light of day at Glasgow one 20th day of July. His schooldays, up to the age of 16, were passed at Bellahouston Academy Secondary School, but no record can be traced of any B.A. degree obtained although he did have a flair for joining the Civil Service. Joe played regularly for his school, and such was his prowess that he was selected to play for Glasgow Boys against London Boys in 1927/8. On leaving school he found a situation in the offices of Messrs Harland & Wolff, the great ship-building firm, whilst he continued his football career with Clydebank with

whom he played as an amateur for six months before joining the Celtic. He remained with the latter Club some fifteen months, and was understudy to the tragic John Thompson. Afterwards he joined Guildford City for a short spell, and also played for Bournemouth before accepting a month's trial with us in August, 1934. He has been here ever since. Height 5ft. 10½ in. Weight 12 st. 6 lb.

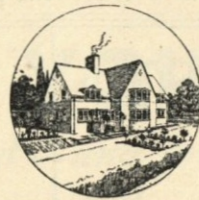

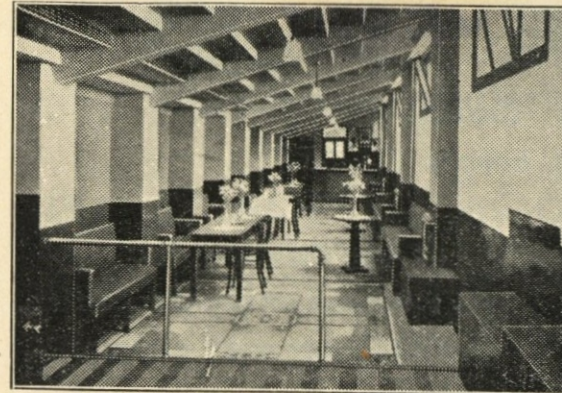
