

Billington Gets 4 —Likes Mud!

Luton Town 5, Chesterfield 0

MUD might have been the big boggy of, forwards yesterday, but the Luton centre, Billington, didn't find it cramped his style. He got four of Luton Town's five goals against Chesterfield, three in the second half.

As a matter of fact, it was surprising how fast the pace was kept, despite the conditions. Time and again the Luton line got going with a swing and threatened danger to the visiting defence with well worked passing bouts.

Chesterfield put in a lot of hard work, but they never seemed to get going as a unit, and even when they drew near goal they seldom threatened danger.

Billington scored the only goal of the first half after clever play by Clarke and Redfern. Chesterfield pressed hotly just before the interval, but Luton deserved their lead.

Early in the second half Redfern shot well from twenty-five yards' range, and Stephenson struck the bottom of the post. From Hughes's centre Bonass narrowly missed getting an equaliser. Then Billington scored a great goal after Stephenson's clever play.

Stephenson increased Luton's lead direct from a free kick. Chesterfield fought back, and Coen showed fine goalkeeping, while there was good defensive work by Luton's rearguard.

Billington added a fourth goal, finishing off Redfern's good play. Billington scored again one minute from the end.
