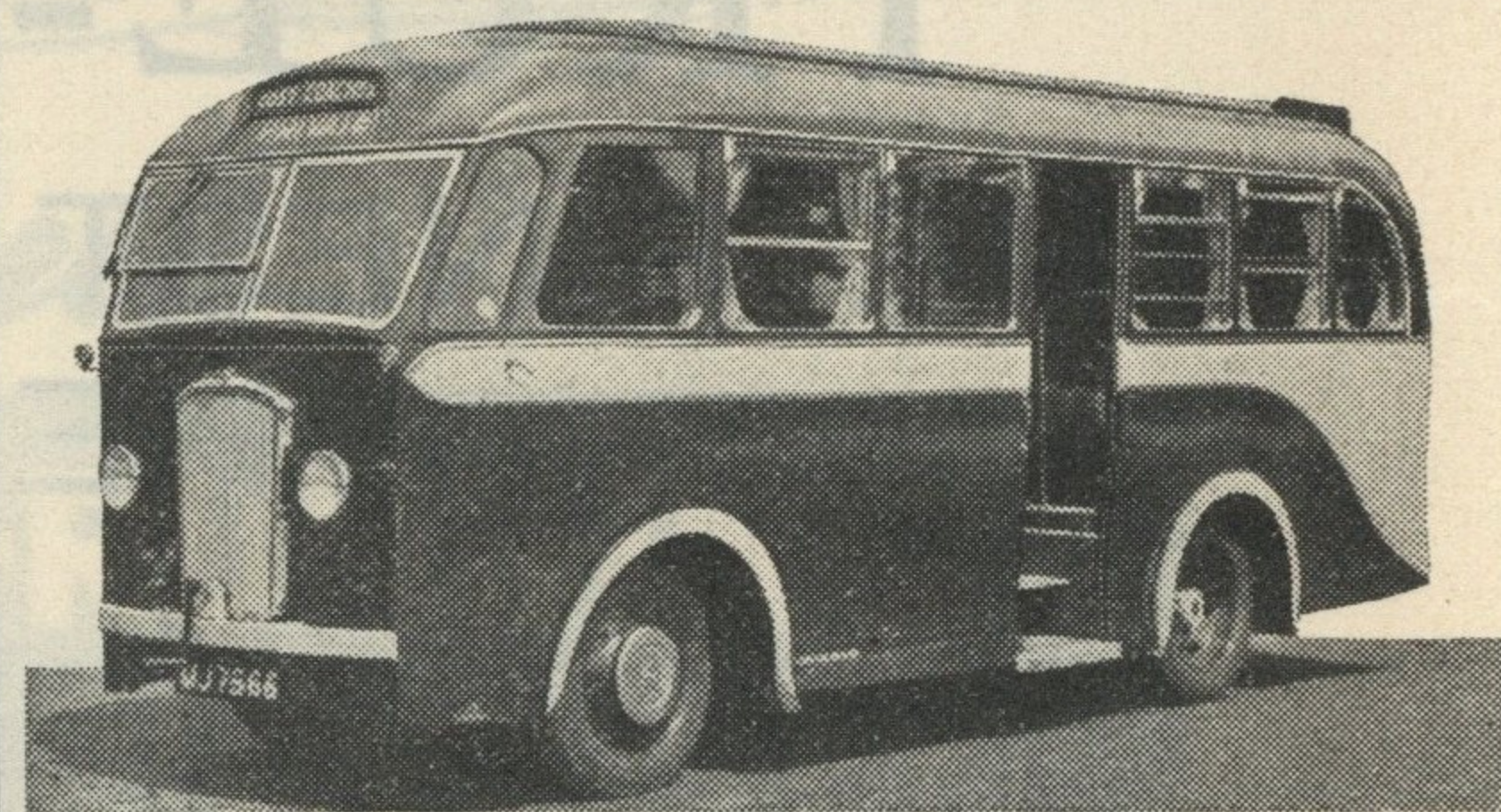

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

OUR match with the 'Hammers' at Upton Park last Saturday, created quite a mild furore in the daily press, but as I did not see the game I do not propose to comment on it except to say that from the various reports I have received the criticisms of our players are vastly exaggerated. From all accounts the daily press want to turn professional soccer into a girls kindergarden school and any attempt of trying to prevent a team winning on their own ground by strong tackling is called foul play. This sensational press makes me tired; only this week other matters appertaining to this club have appeared in the columns and create quite a wrong impression on the public. In the first place Mr. Charles Jeyes has **not** been nominated for a seat in the Football League Management Committee but for one on the London Combination Management Committee. Secondly, Mr. England did **not** appear as an opponent to the three retiring Directors, Messrs Jeyes, Woods and Wright. He was already a Director before the Meeting of the Shareholders for the election of Directors took place. I do wish the daily press would make more certain of their facts before they print them, it may cause them some trouble in the future if they do not.

Anyhow to a more enjoyable topic. We extend a cordial welcome to our visitors from Bury today. Last season they took away both points as the result of their visit and after that display I wondered why they did not hit the promotion trail at the end of the season. Presumably something went wrong somewhere. Today they have a blot to wipe out, they allowed Norwich to defeat them at Gigg Lane last Saturday and the following are a few notes on the players who hope to accomplish it.

George Bradshaw (goalkeeper). Began his career as an amateur for Southport, but his first professional club was New Brighton and was later acquired by Everton. His transfer to Arsenal was made under somewhat sensational circumstances and after a short spell with the 'Gunners' was allowed to go to Doncaster. He joined the 'Shakers' this season.

John Hart (right back). Is one of the youngsters who has made good with the club. Has made many appearances in the Central League side, but had to wait until Gorman was transferred to Brentford before he obtained his opportunity in the premier side.

Walter Aston (left back). Is preferred this week to Gemmell, who has been the regular selection for many seasons. Deservedly

earns his promotion for he has been very successful in the Reserve side.

David Jones (right half). A native of Worksop, he played for his local club before given a trial by Bury in 1934. Showed great promise and was speedily engaged in a full time capacity and has been a regular now for several seasons.

George Matthewson (centre half). The giant of the team, standing 6 ft. 1 in., and weighing 13 stone. Began his career in the Army and was playing for a local side when Bury offered him a trial.

Reginald Halton, (left half). Just scales 6 ft. and has played nearly all his games as an inside forward. An injury to Whitfield, causing a vacancy at flank half, he was pressed into service and with such success that he has retained the position.

Frederick Roberts (outside right). Is preferred to Hulbert who occupied the position against Norwich last Saturday. Has been very successful in the Reserves and is deserving of his promotion.

George Davies (inside right). Born at Earlstown, and was secured by Bury for a mere song. Had a very successful season as a centre forward last term, but an injury in the early part of this season has prevented him playing until quite recently.

Hamilton McNeill (centre forward). Was transferred from Hull City where he was their leading goalscorer last season, and has made up a delightful combination with Davies.

Peter Dougal (inside left). Bury obtained his signature during last close season from Everton, who in turn secured him from the Arsenal. At one time a bad injury was deemed to have ended his career, but he has since recovered.

Edmund Kilshaw (outside left). Appears this week on the extreme left wing. Although only 5 ft. 5 in. in height is very speedy and elusive and always a thorn in the side of his opposing full back. A Lancashire lad, he only came into the limelight towards the end of last season, but already scouts have been on his trail.

The "Stiffs" visit Upton Park this week. I won't add any more to that except that the team will be the same as against Portsmouth last Saturday.

The "A" team are at Spalding and their team is as follows:— Duke; Carr, Fletcher; Goodyear, E. Hindmarsh, Lewis; Carroll, Ferguson, Louqhran, Wale, J. Ward.

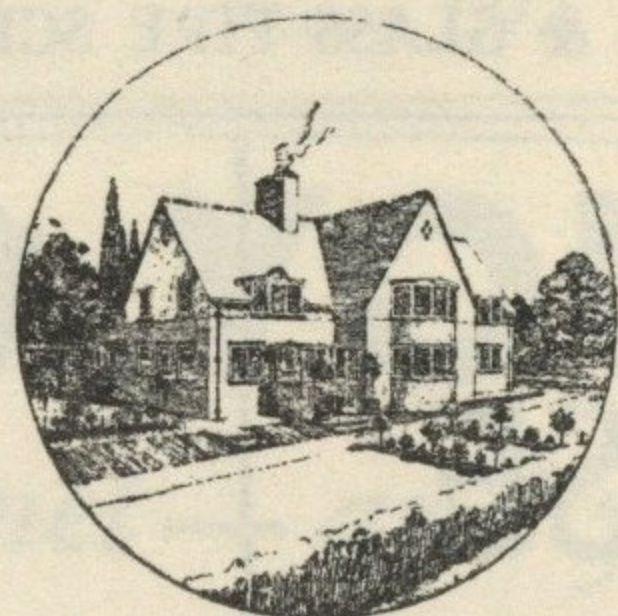

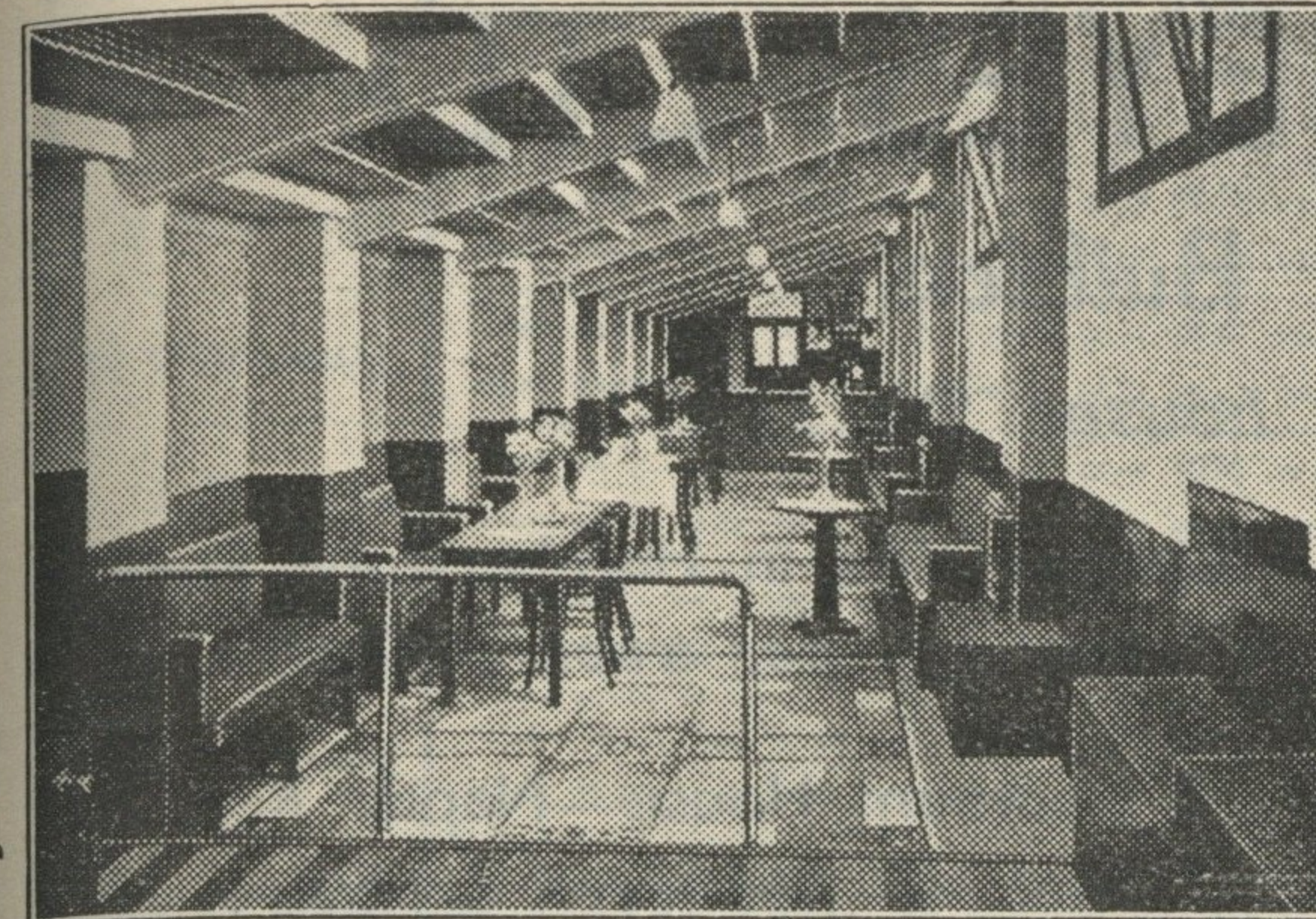
