A VALUABLE away point was picked up at Norwich in spite of a head injury to Hanford and so Wednesday continue to maintain a foremost position in the promotion race. With the old club having matches in hand of all rivals, with the exception of Coventry City, our position is certainly a strong one. But it is yet too early to say that First Division football will be back again at Hillsborough next season.

It does not pay to take matters for granted. One has only to consider the ups and downs of a season to realise that. Take the experience of Manchester City. They opened on a terrifically high note. Then they had casualties and slumped badly as a result. They came again with another challenge. It was sustained for several weeks, then tapered off and while victory, an important one, was gained at Coventry last week, the Mancunians are out of the chase. And the season before last they were League Champions.

Coventry City, too, have held a foremost position. It is not many weeks ago that Mr. Storer's team was regarded as strong favourites. They were playing well and everything was going their way. A month ago something went wrong with the works, injuries came along and while it would be a mistake to rule them completely out, they have a lot to do to regain the ground lost.

Millwall went off with a rush and died away; Fulham were long stayers only to fall away. In contrast reflect on the experience of Chesterfield. They won only one point of their first ten, then began to climb and this morning were only one point behind Wednesday and United, though we have a match in hand.

Take out Blackburn Rovers, who are leading with 46 points, only three points span seven teams fighting for second place honours. What are three points? They are easier dropped than won and with the heavy Easter pro-

gramme ahead anything can happen.

We must, therefore, not see visions, but look to the Wednesday "boys" to fight on with renewed skill and courage and achieve our hearts' desire for us. You'll agree that the men have done exceedingly well, better than expected and the revival has taken place in spite of handicaps owing to injuries.

Our match next Friday is with Millwall at The Den, after which the team go to Plymouth to play the Argyle at Home Park. Millwall come to Hillsborough on Easter Monday. Vital matches against teams capable of springing surprises. We don't want any "shocks."

Our visitors to-day are Luton Town who are to be congratulated on the rise which they have made. No one has mentioned them as strong candidates for promotion, yet they have been playing very steadily and with fair consistency and to-day they come with 40 points, only one behind ourselves with one match more played; level in points with West Bromwich Albion, and Chesterfield; one more than Tottenham Hotspur and two more than Coventry City.

Considering the resources of other clubs such as Manchester City, Fulham, Millwall and West Ham United you must agree that Luton have done themselves proudly.

They have won seven away games, so it is clear that Wednesday will have to take them very seriously this afternoon. One of the features of League football in recent years has been the rise of comparatively young clubs— young that is in the League sense. Look at the way Charlton climbed to fame, followed by Brentford.

Luton is assuredly a centre with great football possibilities and no doubt, the day will come when the "Hatters" will figure in the First Division. There is indus-

trial prosperity in the town, there is enthusiasm for the game and the "Bobbies" are stalwart supporters.

Luton won the Championship of the Southern Section the season before last and won promotion, though they were not new to Second Division Football, as they were members of the Division several years ago.

Actually, they were among the pioneers of football in the South of England and the first all-professional Southern side. The club came into being with the amalgamation of two minor clubs, Wanderers and Excelsior in 1885 and for five years were run as an amateur concern. Then came the first stride towards professionalism when three players were paid the sum of five shillings per week.

On 10th August, 1891, the whole team became professional, with the fee of 2s. 6d. per player per home match and 3s. each for an away match. Then, probably with the idea of encouraging talent in the town and district, any player of Luton was paid double the ordinary fee.

Original members of the old Southern League, Luton eventually gained admission into the Second Division, but after three disappointing seasons, the club returned to the Southern League and after the war were incorporated with the League along with other clubs to form the Southern Section.

Now a few jottings about Luton players:—

Joseph Coen, the goalkeeper, has had experience with Clydebank, Glasgow, Celtic, Guildford City and Bournemouth before joining Luton in 1934.

King and Dunsmore are backs who have won their spurs in commendable fashion. Indeed, Dunsmore has made a notable advance, while John Finlayson, the right half-back, developed with Thornebank (his birthplace) afterwards assisting Motherwell and Cowdenbeath before signing for Clapton

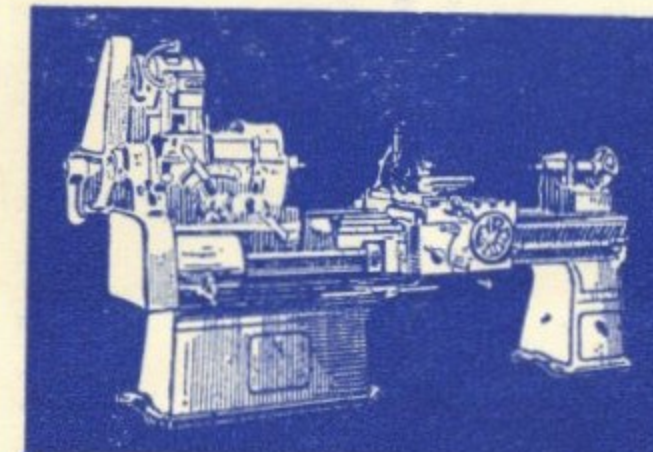

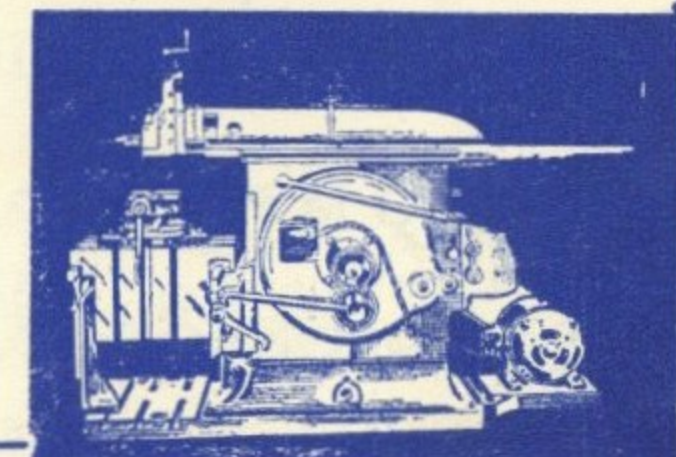

Orient and joining Luton in 1935. Finlayson is a sound and consistent player.

Dreyer, centre half-back, has come to the fore this season and it is to his credit that he has filled successfully the place held so long by John Nelson, who is one of the tallest pivots in football, being well over 6ft. in height.

Nelson used to play for Chorley, the Lancashire Combination club. He left them and had service with Preston North End, Wolverhampton Wanderers before going to Luton from the Wolves four seasons ago. He had three seasons with the Wolves. At one time he was employed in a bleach works.

Frank Roberts, the left half-back, used to be an inside left. He is a native of Greet Green, Staffordshire, and played with Smethwick Highfield and Piggotts (local works team) before signing for Birmingham as a centre-forward. He has been with Luton some four years.

Joe Loughran, wing half-back, is also a former Birmingham player and useful, too.

George Stephenson, the outside left, is not an old Wednesday player. He came out with Stillington, Durham, and after being with Durham City, had three seasons with Aston Villa before passing on to Luton.

Connelly, his partner, was formerly with Newcastle United, a very good player, for we recall how well he played for Newcastle United against Wednesday in the Cup games of a few years ago.

Billington, the centre-forward, has been one of the outstanding successes of the team. He is very fast, clever, and a good shot as his record shows. A Luton "discovery."

Edward Vinall played against Bury last week. This centre-forward, of course, is well-known, for he has played with Folkestone, Sunderland and Norwich City. Very effective.

William Redfern, who can also play at centre-forward, but who is operating at inside right, was born at Connahs Quay and his previous big club was Newry Town. He is nearly 6ft. tall and weighs 11st. 7lbs.

Burgess and Carroll are outside rights of merit, fast and flight their centres well.

SCHOOLBOY FOOTBALL.

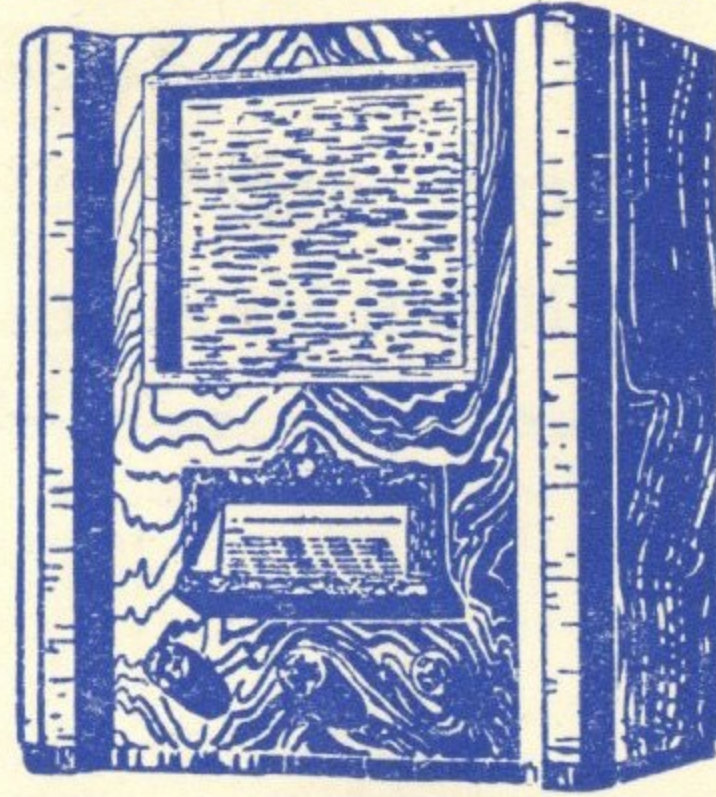

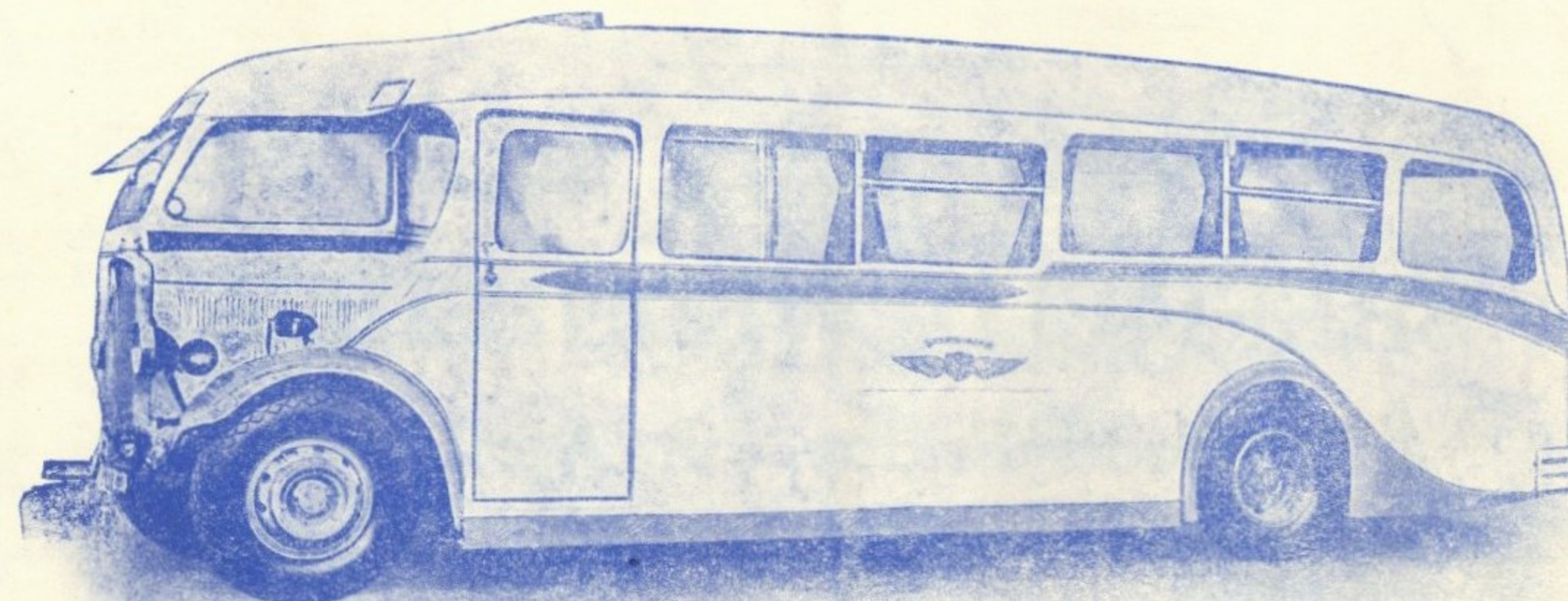

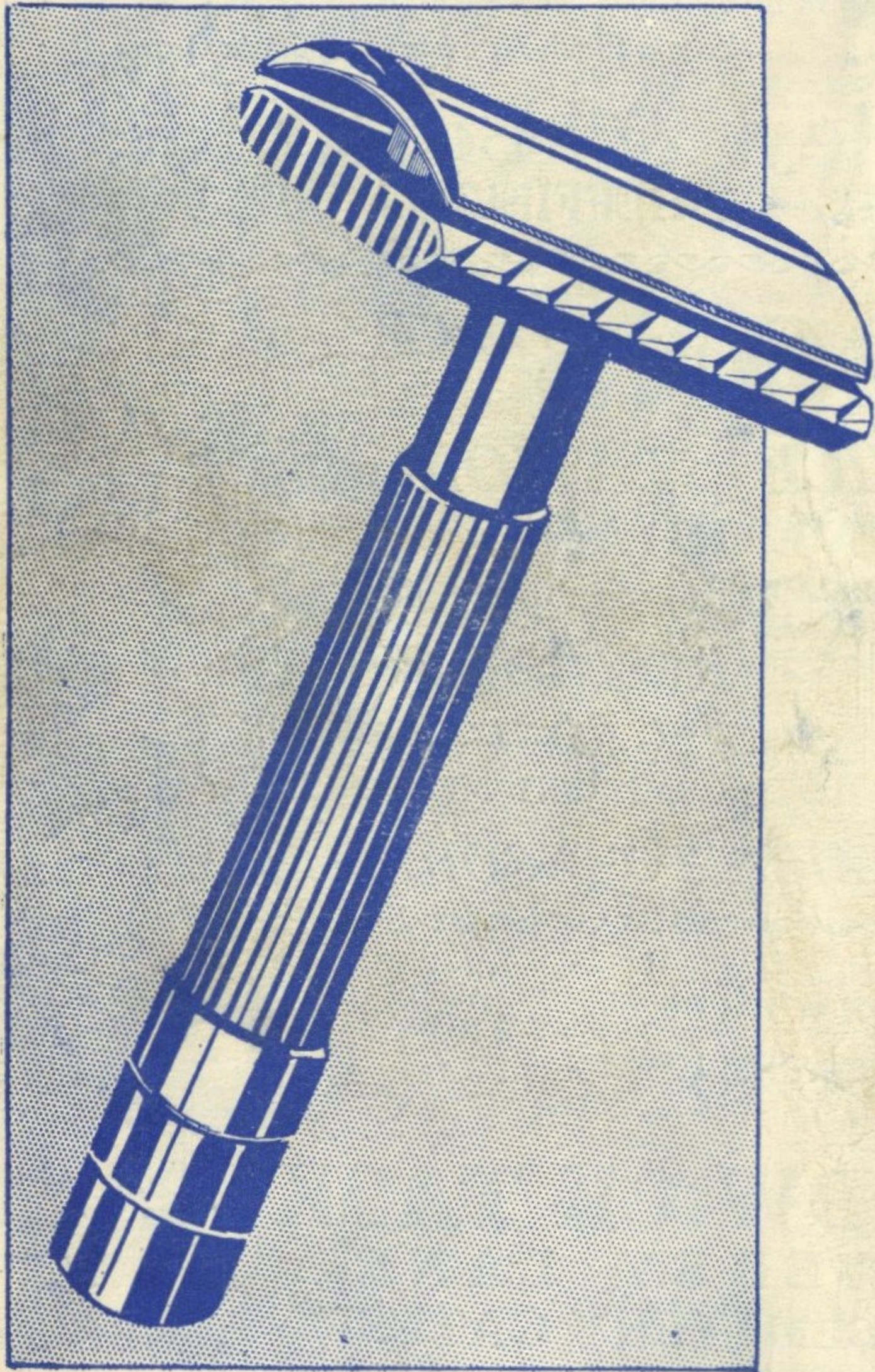
