They have fitted in very well with the rest of the team and so we wish them every good fortune in their new Club. The rest of the team you all know as those who did yeoman service for Luton Town during the war years and what splendid service it was. When it is considered the difficulties all of them had to surmount in order to be here on a Saturday afternoon it is surprising they played as well as they did. No Club was hit harder than Luton Town in the calling up of its Players, and four made the supreme sacrifice. They were Joe Coen, Charlie Clark, John Gillespie and Charlie Ladd. They are not forgotten. In addition of course we lost Sam Mayberry and this also was a big blow. However if we lost a few we also gained, such players as Doug. Beach, Melville Daniel, Billy Waugh and Billy Cook coming here through having been Guest Players during the war. These we shall also see in action this afternoon. The rest of the team is so well known that very little fresh can be said about them except that they all did their bit in the war and some are still engaged in that sphere.

The Staff, as you will notice upon entering the Ground, has been very busy during the close season. It is surprising what a difference a coat or two of paint can make. The pitch itself looks a lot better and it is obvious that it has been receiving expert attention.

We should like to thank the Bobbers' Club for arranging, under these difficult times of rationing etc., such a plentiful supply of Teas and Minerals. There is a lot of unseen activity in making such preparations and it is very much appreciated by the Officials as well as the Supporters.

So give the lads a hearty welcome as they come out, and may the best team win.
