Our team never got together in our match at Bury. Our opponents thoroughly deserved their victory because of their superior team play. We only saw the real Fulham side for one bright spell of fifteen minutes during which period Ronnie Rooke bagged two of his specials and Ernie Shepherd hit the post. Had that ball gone into the net the score would have been 4—3 and anything might have happened, as Bury were thrown right out of their stride, but, scoring two more goals from break-aways made our task pretty hopeless, and in the end we suffered a rather humiliating defeat.

There was a very marked allround improvement in our display against West Ham and it was a real tragedy

that we had to come away empty handed. Had two very easy chances been accepted in the first half we would have held a commanding lead. The injury to Watson perhaps lost us the match as the Hammers got their equalising goal when he was off the field. Ted Hinton, making his first appearance for us, seemed rather overawed by the occasion and started rather shakily, but when he settled down he did his work very well.

Our Reserve side have got off the mark very well, two victories, with a goal average of 12 for, 3 against. Harry Ayres scored four goals in each of these games, eight goals in two matches is good work in London Combination football.

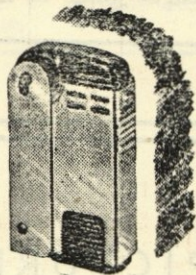

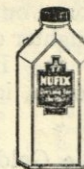

1.—Thomas Lawton, who, for Burnley against Tottenham Hotspur, did so on October 10th, 1936—four days after his 17th birthday.

2.—Alfred Quantrill, the Derby County, Preston North End, Bradford, and Nottingham Forest outside-left, who married the daughter of the late Stephen Bloomer, the Derby County and Middlesbrough inside-right.

3.—Only one in Leslie Goldberg, the Leeds United back.

4.—Carr, a goalkeeper, who played with Bournemouth in season 1923-24. He stood 6ft. 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ ins.

5.—John Slater, a Bolton Wanderers back from 1907 to 1910, who became Mayor of Eastbourne, and

Thomas Phillipson, the former Newcastle United, Swindon Town, Wolverhampton Wanderers, and Sheffield United centre-forward, who was Mayor of Wolverhampton in 1944-45.

6.—Only two, William Meredith and Alexander Turnbull were the outside-right and inside-left respectively of Manchester City's winning team in 1903-4 and of Manchester United's victorious side of 1908-9.

7.—Manchester City v. Stoke, 6th Round F.A. Cup, at Maine Road, 3rd March, 1934. Attendance was 84,569—receipts £5,451.

8.—Chelsea v. Arsenal at Stamford Bridge, 19th October, 1935. Receipts £4,698.

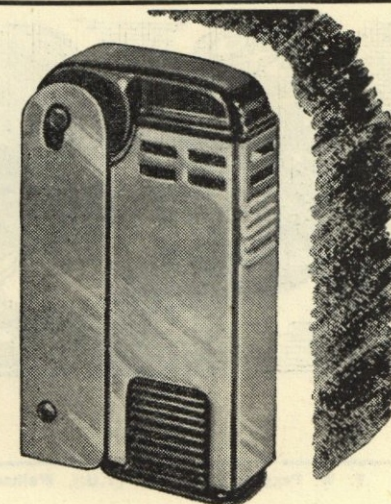
