

#### **BOBBERS NOTES**

#### CLUB NOTES

Today we welcome Barnsley, present leaders of the Second Division, and once more renew acquaintance with Mr. Angus Seed their genial Secretary. They are playing very well just now, beating Bury last Saturday at Oakwell by four goals to nil, which although at home, was quite a good performance. Since then they have strengthened their defence by signing Pat Kelly, goalkeeper of Aberdeen, and it seems that Barnsley are not going to leave any stone unturned in their attempt to gain promotion this season.

We on the other hand are still experiencing the greatest misfortune. Eddie Connelly is still not fit and in addition we now find that Horace Gager is suffering from a fringe fracture on the big toe which will keep him out of the game another two or three weeks. We seem to be fighting against bad luck all the time for we have not yet been able to field a full strength First team this season. The lads filling the places have not let us down, but as they are still youngsters they are not quite ready for this class of football. In Gordon Brice we feel we have a very able substitute to fill the centre half position and we know that he will not let the side down. He played very well last week at Newport and their centre forward, Craddock, did not have a chance of scoring during the whole match. If he can keep such a grip on Robledo this afternoon then there will be a bonus for him after the game.

With regard to the visit to Newport last week, in the second half particularly we played some real copy book football, some of the moves being a joy to watch. The conditions were atrocious—the ground was almost waterlogged and it was raining heavily the whole match, and yet our lads were able to make football look easy. Given normal conditions we feel quite sure we would have won by a much bigger margin. This performance gives us greater confidence for our game today and if the weather is at all kind we shall see a very enjoyable game.

Our supporters will see today for the first time in the Luton Team our latest capture Dally Duncan who last week, although not having a brilliant match, showed he will be a very useful acquisition to our forward line. We feel that his experience will prove very useful and that his delightful centres will be turned to good account by our inside forwards. Melville Daniel had a very good match last week at wing half and we therefore play him again today in this position.
