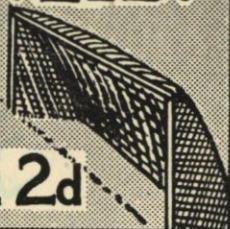

What a disappointment last Saturday's result was, especially to our many supporters who stayed on after the Reserve's game to hear the result given over the mike. And then when we heard that Dally Duncan had received marching orders our cup of woe was indeed full. We will not say much about the incident itself for to do so would be taking an unfair advantage, but we will say that the game was spoilt by the one-sided decisions of the Official in charge. Conditions were at their very worst and consequently players had great difficulty in keeping their feet, and yet every time a Swansea player

went down in a tackle our lad was penalised. However more will be said about this at a later date. We should never have lost both points for although Swansea had most of the game territorially they very rarely looked likely scorers. Our defence played magnificently, but the forwards just could not beat General Mud.
