Our collection today is for the Building Fund, which now amounts to £1,135-19-3. Here we give the result of each collection to date. At the match with Barnsley, £33-2-5; Tottenham, £23-11-7; Newcastle, £10-12-11; West Ham, £5; Notts County, £3; Swansea, £7-1-8; Plymouth, £6-17-0. Total: £88-5-7. The £1,047-13-8 was realised from the Bobbers Club activities. We hope to be able to report that today's collection is a record, so we ask you all to make a special effort. Several supporters have passed a remark this week about the snow, rain and cold weather, and what a pity the Terraces are not under cover, with which the Bobbers Stand Committee heartily agrees Hence the reason for the fund. CLUB NOTES

We have indeed been given a very difficult hurdle to overcome in being drawn against Burnley in the Fifth Round of the F.A. Cup, and if we get through today then the many optimists who really think that Luton is going to make history this season will have their faith in the Club further strengthened. For Burnley is a very good team, few better on their showing so far this season, their defence having been beaten only 19 times in 27 League games, whilst their forwards have scored 40 goals. Our records show 46 against and 47 for in the same number of games, so that while it may be assumed our striking power is slightly better the same cannot be said of our defence. It will therefore be a very interesting match and no doubt the spoils will go to the team which can adapt its game to suit the conditions. Our boys are full of confidence that we shall win, although admitting a very hard game faces them, but having faced this Burnley team already this season at Burnley and bringing away a point, they feel that with the home crowd to cheer them on there is no doubt as to the result. Burnley, of course, are also very confident of winning and are bringing down with them quite a number of their supporters, having sold the whole of their quota of tickets and, in fact, asking for more should we have any difficulty in selling ours! The Press, too, is taking a great interest in this game and it is thought that every London newspaper will be represented here today, as well as quite a number from the North. So those of you who enjoy reading the football results and commentaries in your Sunday papers will have quite a selection from which to choose.

Due to the overwhelming demand for tickets for this game we have gone further into the question of distribution for future Cup-Tie games when we are drawn at home and the following is the scheme upon which we shall work in future:—

- 1. If we win today and are again drawn at home the prices will be the same as for today's match.
- 2. No reservations will be made either by personal application or by telephone. This will be

strictly enforced no matter what the circumstances.

- Apply by letter only accompanied by a stamped and addressed envelope.
- No applicant will receive an allotment of more than two tickets.
- 5. Season Ticket Holders—please mark your envelope "Season Ticket Holder," and your application must be received no later than first post on Friday following the draw. The appropriate Yellow Slip must be enclosed, but if you have a Blue or Green Season Ticket then the Number must be quoted.
- Other applicants please mark your envelope "Cup-Tie Application."

Despite our request for applicants to wait until the prices of tickets for today's match was announced in the Press before making application, the Post Office had to make a special delivery on the Monday and Tuesday mornings as well as the Wednesday morning. Now the majority of those who made application before they knew the prices sent in the wrong money, which meant another letter enclosing the difference. Then, because we refused to deal with these early applications but returned the money, the office has been simply overwhelmed with people and telephone messages grumbling that although their applications were sent very early they could get no satisfaction. Also please do not say that you must have been one of the very first to make application and therefore cannot understand why you are unlucky because there are over four thousand other applicants, each wanting several tickets, who feel they also were first with their applications. We cannot satisfy everybody, we only wish that we could for it gives us no satisfaction to refuse people, but our space is not adjustable and when demand exceeds supply by four or five to one, then quite a number of people must be disappointed. Nearly all applicants say they are regular supporters-where were they all last Saturday? Out of nearly 600 tickets printed for the Plymouth Argyle game only 196 were sold!
