### FOURTH DOUBLE OF THE SEASON

WE completed another double, our fourth of the season, when we defeated Nottingham Forest in the return match, four points having previously been extracted from Leicester City, Millwall and Plymouth Argyle.

There is no stopping our onward march, and since we were beaten at St. Andrews, Birmingham, on November 9 we have taken part in 18 League matches, 14 of which have been won and four drawn, 32 points out of a possible 36, with a goal average of 34 against 12.

That is real championship form, and before this afternoon's match with Luton Town, we were nine points ahead of Birmingham with a match in hand, and three points in front of Burnley with equal matches played.
