CLUB CHATTER. (by "Tyke")

After two goalless games, in which they suffered defeat, Barnsley's 4—1 victory over Fulham was a welcome tonic for their supporters.

Most gratifying feature was the magnificent exhibition of goalkeeping given by Pat Kelly to justify the faith that Manager Angus Seed and others have held in him.

His in-and-out form, on his arrival at Oakwell from Aberdeen, was both surprising and disappointing, and it was not until it was realised that he was a sick man that it could be explained.

Directors and management acted wisely. They sent him home for a complete rest... he did not touch a ball for three weeks... and since then he has gained an ever-increasing circle of admirers by his displays with the Reserves.

Against Fulham he was in brilliant form, made the penalty area his own particular territory, handled the ball confidently and competently, and his uncanny anticipation was equalled only by his fearlessness.

Generally, however, Barnsley were still below the form of which we know they are capable. Half-backs were hesitant against quick-moving and cohesive forwards, and the backs, until they improved, were often in difficulties.

As a result the forwards were given little opportunity to settle down, and although they scored in 47 minutes, it was not until the second half that Robledo found the support he required.

Against Luton, this afternoon, Barnsley will have to go into the tackle with greater speed and "bite," and bring a five-point attack into action.

It is not sufficient to have individual brilliance there must be that crisp, fast, cohesive footwork, which shows an underlying purpose and design.


That the boys can show that, I have not the slightest doubt... they have done so on many occasions.... and if they are in that mood we can look to them to avenge their 3—1 defeat last November
