What thoughts we wonder, as you all eagerly await the slow approach of the time of the kick-off, are conjured in the minds of those of you who were fortunate enough to see the great struggle enacted on this ground on the occasion of the last visit of Newcastle United. What an epic struggle was witnessed that day and even now memories are still very clear on certain incidents in the game, but the one which stands out most clearly, we think, is the one when Alan Driver scored the winning goal. So intent was everyone that it was two or three seconds after the ball had crossed the goal line before the fact was realised that the ball was in the back of the net and never was there such a shout of sheer joy heard in Luton before. Perhaps today we shall have occasion for a further demonstration of the power of our vocal chords for although the conditions are vastly different to what they were on November 30th last, the keenness of both teams at so early a stage in the season to get all the points they possibly can will guarantee another titanic struggle. The Magpies" started off with a very fine win at home last Saturday against Plymouth Argyle, which was further augmented by a win at Chesterfield last Wednesday. Against that we have a win against Brentford to our credit, but will pass over quickly what happened at Coventry last Saturday, for the display of our lads that day was too bad to be true. The win at Brentford has given us that confidence needed for a match such as today's and so we shall be surprised if this game does not prove to be one of the outstanding items of the season. We do give Newcastle a great welcome and may the spoils go to the most deserving side. They are at Birmingham today and Reading on Monday, so that if full points are gained from these two matches then we can expect quite a good crowd down here next Saturday when their opponents will be Fulham.

Next Wednesday evening we play our return game with Brentford here at Kenilworth Road, when we hope to gain our first double of the season. It will be a great send-off if we can pull this off so early in the present campaign.


