### CLUB NOTES

We give a welcome to Kenilworth Road this evening the team known under the pseudonym of "The Bees." Relegated from Division I last season they have yet to gather their first point in Division II and as tonight's is their fourth match we must expect a very hard fight from them. This is just the sort of match we are apt to lose for we had a very hard match last Saturday and having won it a reaction is likely to take place. Having beaten Brentford last Wednesday, at Griffin Park, most supporters will expect both points to be already in the bag but fortunately our players are not taking that view. As was pointed out by one of them, during their 'get-together talk' last week, there is no easy match these days and what on the surface appears a walk-over is the very match a team is likely to lose. However if our lads go on to the field to-night with the same determination that they had last Saturday, then the points will be ours.

We won the game against Newcastle last Saturday quite comfortably after all and never at any period of the game did the "Magpies" look like even sharing the spoils. From the very first kick of the ball our lads were on top and what a treat it was to see them start like this and not take those ten minutes or so to settle down to their game. Our boys were meeting the ball instead of waiting for it to come to them and this was no small reason for their success. If only they could keep up such a standard there is not a team in the Second Division who could even take a point from us here at Kenilworth Road. There is not one player we would point out for distinction, every one played well, all beat individual trickiness every time, as was amply demonstrated last Saturday. Luton will again make the football world raise its evebrows as it did last season, if our lads can continue in this vein. If only our ground was at least twice the size we see it today a lot of our worries would be solved, but as things are it will be a number of years before that very happy state is reached. Meanwhile we are confronted with problems of packing. Last Saturday for instance there were places in various parts of the ground where there was plenty of room and vet quite a number of people had the greatest difficulty in seeing the game at all. This was due principally to the fact that quite a number of spectators arriving fairly early would take up positions near the exits, no doubt to enable them to get away quickly and which no doubt also is an admirable idea, but when it means that those coming after have to push and shove and heave to get through that crust then a lot of pleasure is taken away from their enjoyment. We do therefore earnestly ask you all to get as far away from the exits as you can when taking up position, to ensure a more equitable distribution. The figures last Saturday were 1,792 short of the record made when Tottenham were our visitors last season and vet there was greater difficulty in gaining admittance to the Bobbers Stand and the terraces! We are employing more Stewards to assist in the packing but we want a few more so that if anyone is interested will they please either call or write to the office in Kenilworth Road. And please carry out the directions of the Stewards, for by doing so you will be adding to your own enjoyment as well as to those coming after you.
