CLUB NOTES

Today we have the pleasure of being hosts to Chesterfield in a League II fixture. This is the team which is the enigma of the Second Division. They have yet to record their first home win and vet they have won four and drawn two away matches out of eight played, having scored 11 goals against 10. Last Saturday they played at home against Plymouth Argyle and the score was 1-1, and yet on the previous Saturday they went to Barnsley and won by three clear goals. Out of six games played at the Recreation Ground one has been drawn (already referred to) and the other five have all been lost, the goals for being 2, and goals against 10. This is a record which needs much explaining, especially to the home fans, who like to see their team win most of their home matches. If our away record was as good as our opponents of today we should be standing third in the Table. This unfortunately is wishful thinking, but it might easily have been the case had the luck been just a little in our favour. For there is no gainsaying that if we had had the run of the ball there is only one match we have really lost this season, and that was the first one at Coventry where we do admit we were thoroughly beaten.

Although we lost at Millwall last Saturday by three goals to one, if we had taken our chances there would have been no doubt as to the result. Millwall had 2½ chances and scored three times, whereas we really had many more but they just could not be used to full advantage. However we hope to see two valuable points gained today which would put the lads in fine mettle for their game at Upton Park next Saturday.

We really thought we had managed this week to obtain the transfer of two players we have been trying for some little time to persuade their Clubs to part with, but the Clubs have now decided to play keeps, and so much time and expense has been wasted in the negotiations. This is very disappointing for with these two players we are quite sure we would have a team second to none in this Division, but we keep trying. In view of the splendid capture we have made in Northern Ireland recently we are again trying our luck there and this afternoon Dally Duncan and Hubert Day are both watching a boy we are very interested in and should he come up to expectations then there will be another signing on the dotted line in the immediate future.

Our Reserves are at Swindon this afternoon in a Football Combination game and they should bring back at least a point with them. Micky Walker will unfortunately be out of the game for at least six weeks, due to a torn ligament. The result last Saturday was disappointing but we no doubt would have won in the end despite the brilliant goalkeeping of Lucas if Walker had not had his injury. However that is all in the luck of the game.
