In view of the near approach of Christmas we think a few words about the arrangements we are making for Booking Seats for our holiday matches are called for. To begin with, for the Leicester City match at The Dell on December 13th, tickets will be available at The Booking Office after 1 p.m. on Saturday November, 29th—that is from today. Then on December 13th—the day we play Leicester City—you can book your seats for Doncaster Rovers match on December 20th and for our Bradford City match on December 27th—that is to say seats for both December 20th and December 27th can be booked on December 13th. The Booking Office will be open daily as usual between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. and of course seats can be booked by post, in which case all applications must be accompanied with a remittance and a stamped addressed envelope for reply. Seats cannot be booked by telephone. It will also help us considerably if postal applicants will kindly write in the top left hand corner of their envelope "Tickets" or "Box Office." We make no charge for Booking and so we feel justified in asking our supporters to help us all they can by accepting and conforming to these rules.

Finally a word regarding our new loud speaker equipment. Apart from using this to help in filling the ground, to the greater advantage of all concerned, nothing will be put across it to distract your attention except Team Changes, Urgent Public Calls, and matters of vital importance. We ask you therefore to regard this as a personal service and to give it your attention. It may be you who are requested to report at the office for some important reason. No one can more dislike Loud Speakers—mechanical or otherwise—than I do. So rest assured we shall not broadcast except for a good reason. Incidently after last Saturday I have been told we have discovered a lady announcer with "the golden voice." Well, listen to it, please, and happy going.
