CLUB NOTES

By the time today's matches are concluded footballers all over the country will be very grateful, for whatever football supporters say to the contrary, to travel distances as is the case of most footballers and play a minimum of two matches at the pace at which present day soccer is played necessitates a player being 100% fit.

We wind up our Christmas programme here with a visit from Leeds United and extend to them a most cordial welcome on their very first visit to Luton. We trust, whatever the result of the game may be, that they will carry away with them very pleasant memories of their first journey to the town where the Vauxhalls and Commers are made but also where the hats are made which are known all over the world.

No comment can be made as to how our boys fared vesterday at Elland Road, where our visitors of today were our hosts, as this programme had to be printed before that game was played. We, of course, hope our lads came away with the spoils which, even after Saturday's display against Coventry, could confidently be expected. With any luck at all, even after being two goals down last Saturday, we would have run out winners in the end. But form is a very poor guide, especially at Christmastide.

Christmas to the professional footballer means long journeys, hard games and little or no time at home. Our first team experience was no exception. for on Christmas Day they left Luton on the 5.36 p.m. train which arrived at Leeds at 10.14 p.m., (in a non-restaurant car too). After the game on Boxing Day a dash to Leeds station to catch the 5.15 p.m. train which was due at Hitchin at 8.45 p.m., where a bus was awaiting them in which to complete the journey. It was at first thought that the party would not arrive in Luton until the early hours of this morning but a fine piece of co-operation by the Railway authorities who agreed specially to halt the train at Hitchin, enabled our lads (we hope) to enjoy a little of the Festive Season in their own homes as well as a good nights rest before today's match. We are very grateful to the Railway Companies concerned for this very nice gesture.

The "Stiffs" rose early on Christmas Day to be at Southend for an 11.15 a.m. kick-off. After their splendid win at Ipswich last Saturday, two more points from the "Shrimpers" would help our position in the Combination League Table considerably. Birmingham City Reserves were our visitors here vesterday, and our boys would be all out to take revenge for the 6 to 1 defeat inflicted on us by Birmingham earlier in the season. The "Stiffs" are playing very well just now and their win at Ipswich was all the more creditable when it is realised that seven members of Ipswich first team were playing that day. The Reserves open up the New Year with their first game in the Football Combination Cup by a visit from Coventry City. Kick-off 2.30 p.m., and there is no reason why we should not do just as well in the Cup as we have done in the League.

On Monday next the boys leave for Redcar for a weeks rest and in preparation for the second half of the League Competition and Cup Tie(s). They have a stiff task in front of them and next month. apart from the Cup Tie with Plymouth, the first team visit Newcastle and West Bromwich Albion, our only home game being against Birmingham City providing no replay is necessary with Plymouth. All three teams are at the top of the Second Division and each thinks they will get promotion. It is a very stiff series of matches but the better the opposition the better our lads play so it is going to be a very interesting struggle.

1948 is nearly here and with its advent many will be wondering what the New Year has in store for each one of us. Much may happen and much can and must be achieved in many fields of our daily lives if we are to continue a Great Britain in every sense of the word. It is confidently stated that we are through the worst of our difficulties and it is now a matter of pressing on and consolidating our hard-won position. We sincerely trust that is what the New Year means, for we do not mind hard work if a just reward can be enjoyed for our labours. But we will all face the New Year with confidence and trust it will be a Very Happy and a Prosperous one for each and everyone of us.
