NOTES CLUB

Opposition today is provided by our old friends and rivals from "Craven Cottage," and a thrilling game is anticipated. It will be noticed that after the very disappointing display given by our team last Saturday against Millwall, we have made drastic changes in the forward line in an effort to find the combination which will bring goals. If we are to keep a respectable position in the League we must get goals, and more goals, for it is no good as in last Saturday's game to have seventy-five per cent territorial advantage if at the end of the game we are going to be on the losing side. We are quite sure we have the players on our books who can get the goals if we could find the right combination and so today's line up will be watched with interest and will, we hope, be the answer to our difficulties. Fulham are slightly better placed than us in the Table with a two points lead and a game in hand but there is not much between our two teams as will be seen from the following comparison:-

At the time these notes were being prepared there was every prospect of the fine weather continuing and we trust it continues right over the Easter Holidays, for we could all do with some nice weather on our first holiday of the year. Unfortunately we shall see our First Team in action only once out of the three matches they will be playing, and our Reserve Team not at all. The Stiffs were due to play Leicester City Reserves here tomorrow in a Combination Cup fixture but the game has had to be called off at the last moment due to Leicester being engaged in a County Cup Final Tie in which game they are required by the rules to play their best available Reserve Team. This fixture has been re-arranged for next Wednesday, kick-off 6 p.m., when we hope to see a good crowd, as Leicester have still a good chance of winning their section of the Combination Cup League and this game might have a big bearing on the final positions of the two top Clubs.

They will not be without a cheer as quite a strong band of supporters will be accompanying the Southwick team which, no doubt, will give our Colts a stern test if their previous records are anything to go by. They have won both the Sussex Senior and Charity Cups eight times and are again in the final of the Sussex Senior Cup Competition this season. They have won the Sussex Counties' League four times and are well on the way to achieving this honour again this season as they have a clear lead of about ten points. It will therefore be seen that they are a team of no mean merit and a good game should be witnessed.

We also wish to draw your attention to a very attractive schoolboys' match to be played on this ground on Easter Monday, kick-off 11 a.m., when Luton Schoolboys will be playing Leicester Schoolboys for the Seaward Trophy.
