The way our lads fought at Tottenham last week, made those of us who saw that match feel that there is nothing much wrong with this team. September last, so our lads will be very eager to wipe out that defeat. However we give them a hearty welcome on their visit to Kenilworth Road once more and no doubt it will be a hard-fought game as Barnsley are always a very hard nut to crack, but we live in hopes of our continued success and so raise us a little higher in the Table.
