Three points out of a possible four last week has kept us well in the running for Promotion.

We returned from Griffin Park last Wednesday with a share of the spoils. This match was played in anything like good conditions and a draw was a fair reflection on the game. Jezzard was not fit to resume and we were compelled to make forward changes. Sid Thomas came into the side at outside right. Arthur Stevens moved to inside right and Bob Thomas crossed over to inside left. No goals were scored.

Last Saturday for the visit of Leeds United, this same forward formation lined up but we were compelled to make a change at half-back, Len Qusted having sustained an ankle injury. Arthur Rowley's goal in the second half gave us two valuable points.

We commence a heavy Easter programme this afternoon with a visit from Luton Town, and we extend to them a hearty welcome. Tomorrow we have to visit the Cup Finalists at Leicester and on Monday play our return match with to-day's visitors at Luton. We are hoping that both Beddy Jezzard and Len Qusted will be fit to return to the side

to-day, so that we can start this hard week-end at full strength.

The Reserves did very well in drawing two goals each with Chelsea at Stamford Bridge last Saturday. Johnny Campbell and Robin Lawler had a run out. An injury to Bill Pavitt in the first few minutes of the game upset the side, and Campbell was also injured in the second half. A couple of scorers from Jenkins, one in particular a drive from at least thirty yards, placed us on level terms.

The Reserves also have a full programme this week-end. To-day they are at Bristol, tomorrow afternoon they entertain Charlton Athletic here at The Cottage, and on Monday receive Bristol City here in the return game. Both these home matches commence at 3.15 p.m.

## HERE'S THE ANSWER

1.—Glossop, who had one season—that of 1899-1900—in the First Division.

2.—Ireland, against Wales at Belfast, on November 4, 1933, their half-backs being William Mitchell (Chelsea), Jack Jones (Linfield), and his brother, Sam Jones (Blackpool), who was Mitchell's brother-in-law.

3.—Grimsby Town, who have met all save eight—Aldershot, Bournemouth, Carlisle United, Chester, Ipswich Town, Mansfield Town, Torquay United, and York City—of the other 87 clubs in peace-time Football League matches.

4.—Those of Swindon Town in the Southern Section in 1920-21. In their first game of the season they beat Luton Town at home by

9-1 on August 28, but in their second two days later they lost at Southampton by 4-0.

5.—Woolwich Arsenal, who, in 1907, were fined £25, the Football League also deciding that henceforth all clubs must disburse practice match receipts within 14 days and make a return to headquarters.

6.—Frank Soo, for whom Leicester City paid Stoke City a handsome sum in season 1945-46. Before the post-war resumption of the Football League competitions on normal lines he was transferred to Luton Town in June, 1946.

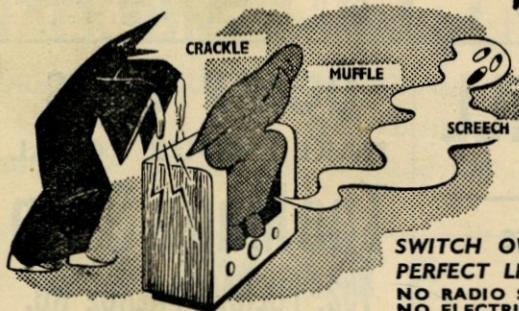
